Mit dem Gigaset elements starter kit und der kostenlosen Gigaset elements app ist es möglich, auf internetfähigen Smartphones Push-Nachrichten zu erhalten und auf die Gigaset elements app zuzugreifen. Um diese Funktionen nutzen zu können, muss das Mobiltelefon mit dem Internet verbunden sein.

Die Funktionalität des Gigaset elements starter kit wird in regelmäßigen, kurzen Intervallen vom System automatisch überprüft. Die Gigaset elements app zeigt an, ob das System einwandfrei funktioniert oder ob ein Problem erkannt wurde. Wird ein Problem erkannt, ist es möglich direkt per Push-Nachricht oder E-Mail informiert zu werden. Einstellungen dafür können in der Gigaset elements app vorgenommen werden.

Voraussetzungen

Zur einwandfreien Nutzung des Gigaset elements starter kits muss die Basisstation per LAN-Kabel an einen funktionstüchtigen Internet-Router angeschlossen werden, der rund um die Uhr mit dem Internet verbunden ist.

Um die kostenlose Gigaset elements app nutzen zu können, muss die App auf einem internetfähigen Smartphone installiert werden. Wegen der ständigen Weiterentwicklungen der Betriebssysteme Android und iOS kannst Du die aktuelle Kompatibilität HIER nachprüfen:

Installation

Basisstation, Türsensor und Bewegungsmelder sind für den Betrieb in geschlossenen, trockenen Räumen mit einem Temperaturbereich von +5 °C bis +45 °C ausgelegt.

Die Reichweite der Basisstation beträgt im freien Gelände bis zu 300m, in Gebäuden bis zu 50 m.
