

## **Procedures**

▶ **(a)** Settings ▶ Device – Display ▶ Sleep ▶ Select time

•	Settings	Tap the <b>Settings</b> app. The Settings menu opens.
•	Device – Display	In the <b>Device</b> area, tap <b>Display</b> .
•	Sleep	Tap Sleep.
•	Select time	Tap the required time

# Safety precautions



Please read these instructions carefully. Failure to comply presents a risk of injury and damage to a device, as well as breaches of applicable laws.

Please explain to your children the contents of this document as well as the potential risks associated with using this device.



Only use chargers approved and certified by Gigaset.

Using incompatible chargers can damage the mobile phone and entail hazardous situations.



This product is fitted with batteries and must not be disposed of in normal household waste at the end of its life.

The symbol with the crossed-out waste bin indicates that the product must be disposed of at a suitable collection point for recycled electric and electronic devices.



The function of medical equipment near your product can be impaired. Bear in mind the technical conditions of the environment in question (such as in doctors' surgery).

If you use a medical device such as a pacemaker, please consult the manufacturer of the product before using the product. You will be provided information on the sensitivity of the device to external, high-frequency energy sources.



This device is not waterproof. Do not keep the device or its accessories in moist environments (in bathrooms and shower rooms for example).

Rain, moisture, liquids and water potentially contain minerals which can cause the electrical circuitry to corrode.



Switch off your mobile phone when in potentially explosive areas and observe all warning signs. Potentially explosive areas also include places where switching off vehicle engines is normally recommended. It is at these kinds of places that flying sparks can be the cause of explosions or fires with resulting injuries, and there may be a risk to life. This pertains to petrol stations and chemical factories for example.

These areas include spaces under ship decks, transportation and storage systems for hazardous chemicals, areas in which the air contains chemical substances or fine particles (such as dust or metal powder particles).



Dispose of faulty devices or have them repaired by our Customer service team. These devices could interfere with other wireless services.



Do not use the device if the display is cracked or shattered. Fragments of glass and plastic can injure hands and face.

Send the device in to Customer service for repair.



High volumes can impair hearing.

Listening to music or conversation with headphones set to a loud volume can be unpleasant and permanently impair hearing.

To prevent loss of hearing, do not have the volume turned up too high for long periods.

If you wear headphones whilst out walking or jogging, please ensure that the cord does not wrap itself around your body or objects on your person.

Only wear headphones in dry environments. The static electricity which builds up on the headphones can discharge via your ears as an electric shock. The static electricity can discharge if you touch the headphones with your hand or touch bare metal before connecting with the mobile phone.

#### **Emergency calls**

Make sure the mobile phone is switched on and connected to the GSM network. Enter the emergency number as required and speak.

Tell the person at the emergency call centre your location.

Do not end the conversation until the person at the emergency call centre asks you to.

#### Children and pets

Keep the mobile phone, batteries, chargers and accessories out of the reach of children and pets. Children and/or pets can swallow the small parts, posing a risk of suffocation and other hazards. A child may only use the mobile phone under the supervision of an adult.

#### Hospitals and medical equipment

- Heart pacemakers, implantable cardioverter defibrillators:
  - When you switch on your mobile phone, ensure that the distance between the phone and an implant is at least 152 mm. To reduce potential interference, use the mobile phone on the opposite side to the implant. Please switch the mobile phone off immediately if interference occurs.
  - Do not keep the mobile phone in a shirt pocket.
- · Hearing aids, cochlear implants:
  - Some digital wireless devices can interfere with hearing aids and cochlear implants. Please consult the manufacturers of these products if interference occurs.
- · Other medical devices:
  - If you and the people around you use other medical devices, please contact the relevant manufacturer for information on whether such devices are protected from radio frequency signals in the environment. You can also consult your doctor about this.

## Switch off your mobile phone in aeroplanes

Please observe applicable restrictions and regulations.

Wireless devices can interfere with the function of aeronautical equipment. Follow the instructions issued by flight personnel when using your mobile phone.

## Vehicles and road safety

The absolute priority for every vehicle driver and everyone in a vehicle is safety on the roads and for road users. Using a mobile phone whilst driving can be distracting and therefore lead to dangerous situations. You can also be violating applicable laws.

#### Use a qualified maintenance service

The installation and repair of products are the sole preserves of qualified maintenance personnel.

#### **Battery**



Not replacing the battery properly can cause a risk of explosion. Dispose of used batteries in line with the instructions.

- Never burn or heat batteries, and do not dispose of them in environments which are at risk
  of heat or fire to prevent battery fluid escaping, overheating, explosion and fire. Do not disassemble, weld and/or modify the battery. Do not keep the battery where it is exposed to
  strong mechanical effects.
- Do not pierce the battery with sharp objects the battery fluid can escape and the battery
  can overheat, explode or catch fire. Crushing, heating and burning batteries are strictly prohibited.
- Do not use any sharp objects (such as screwdrivers) to touch and pierce the battery. All of the
  actions mentioned present a risk of the battery catching fire and burning.
- The battery electrolyte coming into contact with eyes can cause a loss of eyesight. If electrolyte does enter an eye, please do not rub the eye with a hand. Immediately wash the affected eye thoroughly with clear water and consult a doctor.
   The electrolyte coming into contact with skin (or clothing) presents a risk of skin burns.
  - Immediately wash the skin or clothing thoroughly with soap and clear water, and consult a doctor if required.
- Never use batteries for purposes other than those specified. Never use a damaged battery. If
  the battery becomes hot, discolours, deforms or becomes leaky whilst being used, charged
  or kept in a safe place, it must be replaced immediately by a new battery for safety reasons.
- The battery is not waterproof. Never use or charge the battery in a kitchen, bathroom or places with high temperatures or high humidity levels.
- The battery temperature rises during the charging process. Do not keep the battery together with ignitable products in the same drawer as this poses a risk of fire.
- The USB connection must be established with USB version 2.0 or higher.
- Caution: Dispose of used batteries in line with the instructions (Section Waste and environmental protection → p. 83).

#### Charger

- Only use the charger indoors.
- The socket must be easily accessible during the charging process.
- Whilst the phone is charging, do not use the phone for calls or dial any numbers.
- Electrical storms pose a risk of electric shocks.
- Short-circuiting, disassembling and modifying the mobile phone are not permitted because they present a risk of injury, electric shock, fire or damage to the charger.
- The charger is not waterproof. Never use the charger in a kitchen, bathroom or places with high temperatures or high humidity levels as this poses a risk of electric shock, fire and damage to the charger.
- Never charge a mobile phone without the battery inserted.
- Do not use the charger when the power cable is damaged or no battery is inserted in the mobile phone because this poses a risk of electric shock and fire.

Only charge the device when the ambient temperature is between 0°C and 40°C.

#### SIM card, memory card and data connector cable

- Use the right slot/interface when inserting and removing the SIM card, memory card and data connector cable.
- Do not remove the card from the mobile phone whilst data is being sent or received as this presents a risk of data loss and damage to the mobile phone or memory card.
- Do not exert any force when inserting the SIM or memory card and when connecting the data cable because doing so might damage the phone and other parts.
- Charges might apply when establishing Internet connections via the SIM card.

#### Playing games

Playing games on the mobile phone for long periods may mean assuming an unhealthy body posture. Take a 15 minute break every hour. Stop immediately if you feel unwell during game play.

Consult a doctor straight away if your condition persists.

#### More important information on safety

- For your own safety, only use original, approved accessories from Gigaset for your mobile phone. Original accessories can be purchased from Gigaset Customer service (see Customer service → p. 82).
- · Do not charge the battery for longer than 12 hours.
- In the event of malfunction of your mobile phone, battery or accessories, please contact a Gigaset Service Centre for an inspection.
- Never point the flash light directly at the eyes of people or animals. Pointing a flash light too
  near to human eyes poses a risk of temporary loss of eyesight or impairment of vision.
- The device can heat up when running power-intensive apps or programs for longer periods.
   This is normal and has no bearing on the performance of the device.
- When the device warms up, please put it aside for a while and stop the program you were running. Coming into contact with a hot device can cause minor skin irritations such as redness.

#### Important information on using and safekeeping

- The mobile phone must not be used or kept in dusty or dirty places. Dust can be a reason for the mobile phone to malfunction.
- The mobile phone must not be used or kept in excessively hot places. High temperatures can shorten the life of electronic devices and damage the battery, and some plastic parts can deform or melt.
- The mobile phone must not be used or kept in refrigerated areas. Because the mobile phone stabilises to the ambient temperature, condensation can form inside the phone, damaging beyond repair the electronic circuitry. Mobile charging temperature: 0-40°C, mobile use (discharge) temperature: 0-40°C.
- Ensure your mobile phone is not dropped or shaken, or exposed to any impact. Treating the
  mobile phone without due care can shatter the display and damage the electronic circuitry
  and sensitive parts inside.
- Do not apply lacquer to the mobile phone. Lacquer and paint can damage the parts of the mobile phone and may cause malfunction.

## **Getting started**

# Opening the device

 Place your fingernail into the notch in the bottom left of the cover and pull the cover up.



## Inserting SIM and SD cards

Insert a Micro-SIM card into the SIM card slot 1 and push it backwards.

The Gigaset GS160 is a dual SIM smartphone: ▶ Insert a second SIM card into the card slot 2 as required.

## Inserting an SD card (optional)

To store personal data, photos, videos and music, you can insert a MicroSD card into the smartphone.

Insert a MicroSD card into the SD slot 3 and push it backwards.





The device detects SD cards with a storage capacity of 32 GB. Higher capacity cards (to 128 GB) can be used if formatted on the GS160 (not from a PC).

# Inserting the battery

 Insert the battery into the device with the connector contacts facing forwards Insert the battery downwards into the battery compartment.

#### Removing the battery:

➤ To change the battery, place your fingernail into the recess 1 on the right of the battery compartment and pull the battery up.



## Closing the cover

- ▶ Align the cover with the side tabs on the slots on the inside of the casing.
- Press the cover until it clicks into place.

# Charging the battery

- Plug the Micro-USB connector of the charger cable provided into the Micro-USB socket of the smartphone
- Connect the USB socket of the charger cable to a computer's USB port.



▶ Connect the power adapter to the USB connector of the charger cable and connect it to the power source.

The device is charged once the charge icon in the Status bar is filled completely.



So your phone does not discharge during set-up, keeping it connected to the power is recommended until set-up is complete.

## Switching on the device

▶ Keep the On/Off button pressed until the device vibrates.

When you are requested to unlock the SIM card,

use the keypad to enter the PIN of the SIM card

When switching on the device for the first time, a wizard starts which guides you through the initial configuration.

# Wizard for configuring the device

When you switch on your phone for the first time, you are automatically guided through the most important configuration steps.

Back: Check and change as required settings already configured. <

Next > Apply the setting on the screen and jump to the next screen.

Skip Configure the setting later.

## Selecting the language

The set language is displayed.

▶ Select another language as required ▶ tap →



## Inserting SIM cards

This screen is only shown when no SIM card is inserted:

▶ Insert card now (→ p. 10)

Insert SIM card later: > Skip

## **Establishing a WLAN connection**

Wireless networks (WLANs) in range are displayed.

▶ Tap the required WLAN ▶ Enter the WLAN password ▶ Connect ... A connection to the selected WLAN is established

## Setting up a Google account

If you have another device on which emails, contacts, calendar entries and other information is managed, you can transfer this information.



The other device has NFC (Near Field Communication).

#### Transferring the account settings from another device

▶ Select Copy Google accounts, apps and data from another device ▶ Next ▶ ... Run the steps as described

or

Select No, thanks Next

#### Logging in to the existing Google account

▶ Enter the email address and password of your Google account.

or

#### Creating a new account

▶ ■ Enter the email address and password for a new Google account.

# **Entering a name**

You can enter a name to personalise apps.

▶ **Enter First name** and as required **Surname** using the keypad ▶ **Next** 

# Setting up email

Gmail is set up once you log in to your Google account.

This is where you can set up email addresses for other mail accounts. The mails are also displayed in the **Gmail** app.

▶ Select provider ▶ Em Enter access details ▶ Next

If you do not want to set up any more email accounts: Not now

# Setting up protection for the phone

Protect your smartphone from unauthorised use.

#### **Fingerprint**

Add fingerprint ► Next ► ... A wizard opens to guide you through the necessary steps.

or

#### PIN, pattern or password

- ➤ Configure PIN, pattern or password ➤ Next ➤ Select Pattern | PIN | Password ➤ Next ➤ Specify whether the selected protection applies also for starting the device
- ▶ Enter pattern, PIN or password ▶ Next ▶ Repeat ▶ Confirm

## Settings for notifications

▶ Select how notifications are displayed when the phone is locked ▶ Next

## **Using Google services**

Various services are displayed.

▶ Use the switch to enable/disable the service you want to use ▶ Next



Performing this step also means you accept the conditions of use and data protection declaration of Google.

## Settings for the start screen

The start screen is displayed. You can specify various settings for the start screen.

▶ Touch and hold the wallpaper on the start screen

## Changing the wallpaper:

 Wallpaper . . . Images saved on the device are displayed ▶ Select the wallpaper ▶ Tap Choose wallpaper from

#### Making widgets available on the start screen:

▶ Widgets ... The available widgets are displayed ▶ Touch and hold the required widget ... The start screen is displayed ▶ Position the widget and release it at the required position

# Switching the device on and off

#### Switching on

▶ Press and hold the On/Off button ▶ Unlock the display if required (if a display lock is set up to protect against unauthorised starting) ... The device is started

On/Off button -> p. 3

Display lock: → p. 57

## Unlocking the SIM card

▶ Enter the PIN for the SIM card ▶ OK

#### Removing notifications (if available)

Clear notification: Swipe to the left or right

Deal with notification later: 

Swipe upwards to the Notifications bar

Notifications → p. 22

## When a display lock is set up to protect against unauthorised use

▶ Unlock the display ... The start screen is displayed

Display lock: > p. 57

## Switching off

Press and hold the On/Off button ▶ Tap Power off ▶ OK



You can also switch the smartphone to **Aeroplane mode**. This only disables the wireless functions, the other device functions remain available.

## Switching on and off at certain times

Automatically switch the smartphone on and off at certain times.

Set the time at which you want to switch the device on or off:

▶ Time ▶ Set the time ▶ OK

Select the days on which the schedule is to apply:

▶ Repeat ▶ Select the days ▶ OK

Save the setting: Done



Before you can use the device after automatic switch-on, you must unlock the SIM card and the display.

# Switching the device to and ending idle mode

#### Switching the device to idle mode

Briefly press the On/Off button



If the device is not used for a defined time, it automatically switches to idle mode.

#### Setting the period of inactivity for transitioning to idle mode

▶ (a) Settings ▶ Device – Display ▶ Sleep ▶ Select period

#### **Ending idle mode**

▶ Briefly press the On/Off button ▶ Remove any notifications as required ▶ Unlock the display



Some apps can be accessed directly from idle mode with a fingerprint ( $\rightarrow$  p. 30) or code ( $\rightarrow$  p. 24).

# Using the touchscreen

Movements and gestures for using the touchscreen:

#### **Tapping**

▶ Briefly touch the screen with your finger

#### **Examples:**

Start an app, and select function or setting: tap the element

Enter text: Tap a text field ... A keypad is shown

#### Touching and holding

Keep your finger on an element until it responds.

#### Dragging and releasing

➤ Touch and hold the element ➤ Move your finger across the screen to the place required ➤ Release the element

Example: Moving apps on the start screen

#### Swiping or dragging

Move your finger quickly across the screen without stopping

Example: Switching between the start screens

#### Double tapping

▶ Tap the screen twice quickly in succession.

Example: Zooming. Only possible for special screens (such as websites or maps).

Zoom in: Tap twice quickly in succession

Zoom back out: Tap twice again

#### Getting to know your device

#### Spreading apart / pinching together your fingers

▶ Place two or more fingers on the screen at the same time

Zoom in:

- ▶ Spread your fingers apart
- Zoom out: Pinch your fingers together

Example: Scaling screen content. Only possible for special screens (such as Google Maps and Chrome).

#### Start screen

A start screen is displayed when you switch on or unlock the device, and no app is open.

Elements on the start screen - p. 4

You can create several start screens and configure them as you wish - to be able to quickly access favourite apps and content ( p. 20).

#### Returning to the start screen from any user situation

► Tap the Navigation button ○ ... The start screen which was open last time is displayed

#### Switching between start screens

Swipe left or right to the required start screen.



# **Browse smartphone and Internet**

At the top of every start screen is Google search, enabling you to search on your smartphone and browse the Internet.



#### Entering a search term

▶ Tap the Search bar ▶ Enter a search term using the keypad ▶ Q

#### Search using voice entry

# Switching between start screens and apps

At the bottom of every screen are three Navigation buttons:



- Opens the screen last viewed, even if it belongs to another app. You can go back several times (only as far as the start screen).
- Opens the start screen which was open last time.
- Opens an overview of the apps and browser tabs used last time.

When the Navigation buttons are not shown: Tap the bottom of the screen

# **Quick settings**

The quick settings enable you to access frequently used settings from all user situations, such as screen lighting, WLAN, Bluetooth and similar settings.

#### Opening the quick settings

 $\blacktriangleright$  From the Status bar, swipe down using two fingers  $\dots$  The quick settings are displayed

Icons of the quick settings - p. 84

## **Enabling and disabling a function**

▶ Tap the setting ... Settings are white when enabled and not shown when disabled

# Changing a setting

Settings for which there are more options (e.g. WLAN or Bluetooth) have a small arrow next to the name.

▶ Tap the name under the icon ▶ Change the setting as required

# Quick settings for ringtone volume

Adjust the ringtone volume to the ambient conditions or situation.

## Selecting an audio profile from the quick setting screen

From the Status bar, swipe down using two fingers ... The quick settings are displayed Tap



Volume set as in profile General (→ p. 50)



Silent: Ringtone and vibration disabled



Meeting: Vibration only



Outdoors: Loudest ringtone and vibration

# Writing and editing text

Use the Google keypad to write text.

## Opening the keypad

▶ Tap a place where text can be entered

You can enter letters, digits and special characters.

Switching between entry of letters and digits / special characters: ▶ Tap 7123

# Configuring the start screens

You can create several start screens and configure them as you wish - to be able to quickly access favourite apps and content.

## Tailoring the Favourites bar

At the bottom of every start screen is the Favourites bar, from which you are able to quickly access the apps you use most frequently.





Opening the menu with all the apps: Tap the ioon in the middle The apps in the App menu are in alphabetical order.

Scrolling through the list: > Swipe up or down

## Removing apps from the Favourites bar

- ▶ Touch and hold an app in the Favourites bar
  - Drag the app to the Remove button at the top of the screen and release your finger or
  - Drag it to somewhere else on the screen and release your finger

## Adding an app

▶ Select the required app ▶ Touch and hold the app ... The start screen is shown in the background ▶ Drag the app to a free space in the Favourites bar and release your finger.

# Changing the wallpaper

Touch and hold the wallpaper ▶ Tap Wallpapers
 ▶ Select an image from the predefined backgrounds or your own photo from My photos
 ▶ Tap Set wallpaper



More wallpaper images can be downloaded from Google Play.

# Adding an app to a start screen

Open the App menu Look for the required app ➤ Touch and hold the app ... ➤ Drag
the app to a free space in a start screen and release your finger

## Adding a widget to a start screen

Widgets are components that are specifically intended to be displayed on a start screen, e.g. a clock, a calendar extract for the current day, an important entry from the contact list or a direct dial.

- ▶ Touch and hold a free space on a start screen ▶ Tap Widgets
- ▶ Touch and hold the required widget ... Images for the start screen are shown in the background ▶ Drag the widget to a free place on a start screen and release your finger

The sizes of some widgets can be changed:

➤ Touch and hold a widget ➤ Release your finger ... If the size of the widget can be changed, you see a dotted frame on the edges ➤ Change the size of the widget by dragging the dots

Once the correct size is set: Tap anywhere outside the widget

## Moving apps and widgets

▶ Touch and hold an app or widget on a start screen ▶ Drag the app or widget to the required position and release your finger, or drag it to the left or right to another start screen and release your finger

## Creating folders for apps

- ▶ Touch and hold an app on a start screen ▶ Drag the app icon over another app icon Adding apps:
- ▶ Touch and hold an app ▶ Drag it to the folder

Renaming a folder:

Open the folder ▶ Tap the name ... The keypad opens ▶ Delete the old name ▶ Enter the new name ▶

# Removing an app or widget

▶ Touch and hold an app or widget on a start screen ▶ Drag it up to option Remove and release your finger

## Adding, rearranging and removing start screens

The number of start screens set up is shown by dots above the Favourites. The bigger dot indicates the position of the current start screen.



#### Adding start screens

▶ Touch and hold an app ▶ Drag the app all the way to the right until a blank start screen is shown ▶ Release your finger . . . A new start screen is created and the app is placed on it

#### Rearranging start screens

 Touch and hold a free space on a start screen . . . Images for the start screens are displayed in the background ▶ Touch and hold an image for a start screen ▶ Drag it to the left or right to the required position and release your finger

#### Removing a start screen

 Remove all apps and widgets from a start screen (by deleting them or moving them to another start screen) ... When the last app or widget has been removed, the start screen is deleted

## **Notifications**

Notifications inform you about various events, such as the arrival of a new voice message or email, appointments or wake-up calls.

Notifications are displayed as follows:

- In the Notifications bar: ► Swipe over the screen from the top down
   An icon in the Notifications bar denotes which notifications are available (→ p. 84).
- · On the lock screen: when the phone starts and when returning from idle mode
- At the top of the screen whilst you are doing something else on your phone, such as reading an email or watching a video

# **Dealing with notifications**

# Viewing and responding to notifications

Which information is displayed and which actions are possible depend on the app which triggers a notification.

Some apps allow actions to respond to a notification. You can for example reply directly to a mail, switch off a wake-up call or show on the map the meeting place for an appointment.

Displaying the app from which the notification originates:

▶ Touch and hold the notification ... The name of the app is displayed

# **Deleting and resetting notifications**

Deleting a notification:

Swipe the notification to the left or right

Deleting all notifications on the Notifications screen:

▶ Scroll down to the end of the notifications ▶ Tap

Resetting a notification on the lock screen or at the top of the screen to read it later:

Swipe the notification up

# **Settings for notifications**

## Changing the default notification sound

▶ ② Settings ▶ Device – Sound & notification ▶ Tap ☆ next to General ▶ Default notification sound ▶ Select a ringtone ▶ OK



- If you do not wish to be disturbed, you can mute your device. No notification sound is then played.
  - Use the "Do not disturb" function to mute your device p. 31
- In some apps, sound and vibration settings for notifications can be set directly in the app from the **Settings** menu.
- If the volume for the ringtone is reduced down to Vibration mode ( p. 50), the
  device vibrates for notifications instead of playing a sound. The smartphone
  continues to vibrate for notifications for which Vibration mode is already selected.

## Changing the settings for app notifications

Specify how and when notifications for an app are displayed.

- ► Touch and hold an app notification ► Tap **1** or
- ▶ ② Settings ▶ Device Sound & notification ▶ Notification ▶ App notifications... All apps are displayed ▶ Select an app ▶ Enable or disable the required option using the switch
- Select the **Treat as priority** option when you also want to receive app notifications when the "Do not disturb" function is enabled ( p. 31).

#### Checking the settings for all apps



# Apps

The apps available on the device are stored in the App menu. The device is supplied with a number of default apps. Additional apps from your mobile operator are installed as soon as you insert a SIM card.

You can download and install more apps, or disable and uninstall existing apps.



You can place frequently used apps directly on a start screen  $(\rightarrow p. 20)$ , and the four most important apps in the Favourites bar  $(\rightarrow p. 20)$ .

## Opening and exiting apps

## Opening an app from the App menu



The start screen is open. If not: Tap

▶ Tap **…** All apps are displayed (sorted alphabetically) ▶ Tap the app you want to open

## Quick access to apps

If the device is in idle mode, you can open an app using the letter code.



Smart Features and the letter code for the app are enabled.

#### **Enabling/disabling Smart Features**

#### Enabling/disabling letter codes

The following letters are available as codes: c, e, w, o, m, s, z and v. Some letters are already assigned to apps. The apps assigned are within square brackets. You can change this default assignment. For codes not assigned by default, there is nothing within the brackets.

#### Assigning an app

#### Opening an app with the help of code

With the device in idle mode, write a big letter for the app code on the display ▶ If the display is locked, unlock it ... The app opens

#### Exiting an app

# Installing/uninstalling apps

## Installing new apps

Downloading apps from Google Play:

■ ▶ Play Store ... The Google Play Store is opened ▶ Look for the app you want ▶ Open the app screen Install

## Uninstalling or disabling apps

You can delete apps you no longer need from the device.

You can uninstall apps you have downloaded. They are completely removed from the device. Apps preinstalled on the device (system apps) can be disabled but not completely removed. Disabled apps are not show on the device.



Disabling a system app can cause problems with other apps.

■ ► 🔯 Settings ► Device – Apps ► Select an app you want to uninstall ► Uninstall /

or (for apps which can be uninstalled)

■ ▶ Touch and hold the app you want to uninstall ▶ Drag it to Uninstall and release your finger

# Protection from harmful apps

## Downloading apps from sources other than Google Play

If you want to download apps from sources other than Google Play, you must permit it explicitly.



Apps from unknown sources can represent a security risk for your smartphone. A download can corrupt your smartphone, and personal details can be misused or go missing.

▶ m ▶ m Settings ▶ Users – Security ▶ Enable the Unknown sources switch ... You can now install apps from other sources

## **Enabling Verify apps**

When the function is enabled, your device verifies apps when being installed, and regularly searches the device for potentially harmful apps.

The following actions are possible when you install an app which is not from Google Play:

- Recommendation not to install the app.
- Installation of the app is blocked when there is a threat to the security of the device.
- Information on the app's identification is sent to Google, such as protocol information, URLs connected to the app, the device ID, its operating system version and the IP address.

Apps installed on the device are checked regularly. If a potential harmful app is detected, the app check can take the following actions:

- Recommend that you uninstall the app immediately.
- Remove an app which is known to be insecure.

## Improving the detection of harmful apps



The Scan device for security threats function is enabled.

If the function is enabled, Google also receives anonymous information on all apps installed which are not from the Google Play Store. This helps Google to provide better protection for users against harmful apps.



This option might not work for all apps because developers are able to disable this function to prevent their apps being subjected to verification.

## **Downloads**

You can download files from websites onto your device. Downloaded files are stored mainly in the **Downloads** app.



Content such as music, TV programs and books are generally not stored in **Downloads** but in the app with which the download was performed.

## **Enabling/disabling Turbo download**

Quickly download big files. When Turbo download is enabled, data is downloaded in parallel over WLAN and the mobile data connection.



WLAN and data connection are enabled.

▶ ☼ Settings ▶ Wireless & networks – Turbo download ▶ Enable/disable the function with the switch

When Turbo download is enabled, the  $\psi$  icon is displayed in the Notifications bar. During a transfer process, the message shows the data volume being transferred over WLAN and the mobile network.



Turbo download is automatically disabled when Roaming, Tethering or VPN is active. Additional charges might apply when downloading over mobile networks ( $\rightarrow$  p. 73)

# Fingerprint sensor

The device has a fingerprint sensor ( p. 3). It enables for example the device to be unlocked using a fingerprint, purchases to be authorised, you to register with certain apps and opening of a contact quickly from idle mode.

## Setting up the fingerprint

When a display lock is set up:  $\blacktriangleright$  Enter the pattern, PIN or password

If a display lock is not yet set up: > Set up screen lock (>> p. 57)



Pattern, PIN and password are alternatives to the fingerprint.

The alternative method must be used in the following cases:

- The fingerprint is not recognised after several attempts
- · For editing fingerprint settings
- When it has been more than 48 hours since the alternative method was used for unlocking

#### Scanning a fingerprint

- Place your finger onto the sensor on the back of the device. Hold the device as you will also hold it later for unlocking.
   Next
- Keep tapping the sensor until the Fingerprint added! message is shown. Keep changing the
  position of your finger.

Ending the scan: Done

Add more fingerprints > Add another



You can add up to five fingerprints. They are saved as Finger 1 to Finger 5.

Note that all those who add their fingerprints are able to unlock the phone and authorise purchases with your account.

Fingerprints are stored securely and never outside the device.

# Changing a fingerprint name

Assign a suitable name for the fingerprint, e.g. "Index finger left".

▶ ② Settings ▶ Users – Fingerprint ▶ Fingerprint Manager ▶ Use the alternative method for unlocking (pattern, PIN or password) ▶ Touch and hold the name ▶ Enter the new name in the text field (max. 15 characters) ▶ OK

## Locking an app with a fingerprint

Specify which apps can only be opened with a fingerprint.

▶ ② Settings ▶ Users – Fingerprint ▶ App-Sperre ▶ Use the alternative method for unlocking (pattern, PIN or password) ... The app list is displayed ▶ Use the switch to enable/ disable apps to be opened only with a fingerprint



The setting applies for all registered fingerprints.

#### **Quick start of functions**

Select the functions to be started with prolonged pressing on the fingerprint sensor. Possible functions: Open the camera, take a photo from the viewfinder screen of the camera, accept a call and cancel a wake-up call.





The settings apply for all registered fingerprints.

## Quick start of apps and contacts from idle mode

Open an app or a contact with a fingerprint from idle mode. Take several fingerprints for the quick start of different apps or contacts.

- ▶ Tap Settings ▶ Enable/disable the Quick boot function with the switch ▶ Select an app or a contact for the quick start with fingerprint

App: ▶ Tap **Apps** ... The app list is displayed ▶ Select the app

Contact: ▶ Tap Contacts ... The contact list is displayed ▶ Select a contact

# Using a fingerprint

If an action can be authorised with a fingerprint, the  $\bigcirc$  icon or alternative pattern is displayed, for example when a display lock with fingerprint is set up or an app is locked.

▶ Tap the fingerprint sensor with a finger which has been scanned ▶ Repeat the process as required

The alternative method is enabled automatically if the fingerprint is not recognised after several attempts.

## "Do not disturb"

The "Do not disturb" function mutes the device. It does not ring or vibrate. It prevents for example the phone ringing at night and during meetings, and all interruptions apart from a wake-up call. You can choose between three modes:

#### Total silence (total silence)

No ringtones, no vibrating, no audible signalling of wake-up calls or notifications, no sound for music, videos, games or other media.

#### Alarms only

Signalising of wake-up calls, also the sound for music, videos, games or other media is turned on.

#### Priority only

Signalising of important notifications, also the sound for music, videos, games or other media is turned on.

Important notifications are messages from apps with setting **Treat as priority** ( p. 23). Further events can be defined as important interruptions, such as calls from certain people.



"Do not disturb" can also be enabled automatically in line with defined rules. Defining the rules: → p. 51

## Enabling "Do not disturb"

- ► From the Status bar, swipe down using two fingers . . . The quick settings are displayed ► Tap Do not disturb
- Select the required mode (Total silence / Alarms only / Priority only) ▶ Specify how long the setting is to apply (Until you turn this off or use +/- to choose a time period in hours) ▶ Done . . . The following icon is displayed in the Status bar:

Total silence: (a) / Alarms only, Priority only:



You can also set the Alarms only mode as follows:

 With the display enabled, keep the Quiet button on the right of the device pressed until the volume has reached the lowest setting 
 ▶ Press the Quiet button again ... The Alarms only mode is enabled

## Disabling "Do not disturb"

► From the Status bar, swipe down using two fingers . . . The quick settings are displayed ► Tap the or icon . . . All signals are turned on again and the icon is displayed

or

▶ Press the Quiet button on the right of the device ▶ Tap End now ▶ Set the volume as required

#### Disabling "Do not disturb" for certain apps

▶ ② Settings ▶ Device – Sound & notification ▶ Notification ▶ App notifications... All apps are displayed ▶ Select an app ▶ Select option Treat as priority ... Notifications for this app are permitted in the Priority only mode

## Specifying important interruptions

Specify events which are to be signalled acoustically in the **Priority only** mode.

From the Status bar, swipe down using two fingers . . . The quick settings are displayed ▶ Tap
 Do not disturb ▶ More settings ▶ Priority only allows ▶ Enable/disable events for
 Alarms, Reminders, Events and Repeat callers with the switch

Messages and calls are not signalled acoustically by default (setting **None**). To change the setting:

Tap Messages / Calls ► Select the required option (From anyone, From contacts only, From starred contacts only)

Selected contacts are denoted as favourites in the contact list ( p. 42).

## Additional functions

## Creating screenshots

Take a screenshot of the smartphone as an image, and edit, share and send it.

## Taking a screenshot

- ▶ Open the screen for which you want to create a screenshot.
- ▶ Press the On/Off and Volume buttons at the bottom at the same time.

or

▶ Use three fingers to swipe over the screen from the top down or bottom up



The function is activated.

The screen content is stored in the internal memory of the device. The Law icon is displayed in the Notifications bar.

# Sending files between a computer and the smartphone

Use a USB cable to send photos, music, ringtones and other files between a computer and the smartphone.



A computer detects the device connected via USB. It is linked in as a drive.

## Connecting the USB cable

 Use the USB cable provided to connect the phone to a computer ... The provided in the Notifications bar.



## **Transferring files**



For data interchange with a Mac: Android File Transfer is installed and started on the computer.

Swipe the Notifications bar down ▶ Tap the USB notification ▶ Select File transfers
 Windows: Automatic drive detection is opened on the computer ▶ Open Windows Explorer ▶

Windows: Automatic drive detection is opened on the computer ▶ Open Windows Explorer ▶ Use drag-and-drop to move files as for other external drives

Mac: The Android File Transfer window is opened on the computer ▶ Use Drag-and-Drop to move the files

## Managing music

Use the Music Manager to upload music from the computer to the Google Play media library. For information on managing music with Google Play Music: → Google Help

# **Printing**

Apps with a print function enable you to print from your device.



A printer is available which is able to receive data over a WLAN connection or mobile network.

## Printing via apps

The procedure for printing depends on the used app.

▶ Open the menu from icon or Tap Printing

Printing the screen content: Take a screenshot (p. 32) and then print it.

# Making calls

To make calls, use the . Phone app. It is in the Favourites bar on the start screen by default ( p. 20).

Whilst a number is being entered, contacts with a potential matching phone number are displayed. If there are no matching entries, you can add the entered number to the contact list.

▶ Tap ♣ ... The contact list opens ▶ Select an entry ... All phone numbers stored for the contact are shown > Tap the required phone number

#### Using a phone number of a favourite contact

Tap ★ ... The Favourites list opens ▶ Tap the required contact ... The main phone number of the contact is selected

#### Using a phone number from the call log

Calls can also be initiated from some other apps or widgets, such as from the Contacts app.



# Accepting a call

With an incoming call, the phone number of the caller is displayed, if available. Information on the contact or the Caller ID is also displayed.

#### Rejecting a call and sending an SMS to the caller

If your mobile network operator has set up a mailbox for you, callers whose calls have been rejected by you can leave a message.

If you accept a call whilst talking to somebody else, the current call is put on hold.

# Recording a call

Tell the person you are talking to that the call is being recorded.

#### Listening to a recorded call:

## Consultation, call swapping

► Tap ► Add call ► Enter the number for a second person or select this person from the contacts ► Tap ► ... The call is initiated. The first call is put on hold.

The current call with phone number is shown at the bottom of the screen, and the call on hold as **On hold**.

Switching between calls (call swapping):

▶ Tap **On hold** ... The call on hold becomes the active call

### Merging two calls into a conference call

One call active, one call on hold.

▶ Tap ▶ Merge calls ... The calls are merged

## Making calls over WLAN

Make calls over WLAN and the Internet instead of the mobile network.



Your mobile network operator supports calls over WLAN and/or using SIP telephony. Additional charges may apply. Contact your mobile network operator for more information.

Using a WLAN call function of a mobile network operator:

▶ Calls ▶ Enable/disable the Wi-Fi Calling option with the switch



If this option is not available, the function is not supported by your mobile network operator.

To make calls over WLAN, use the VoIP service from the mobile network operator (SIP):

▶ Calling accounts ► Use SIP calling

## Using TTY for calls

In TTY mode (Telephone Typewriter), those with speech and hearing impediments can communicate by entering text on a smartphone.



The smartphone is connected to a special teletypewriter or other TTY service via USB.

### **Enabling TTY mode:**

▶ **Cape Settings** ▶ **Accessibility** ▶ **TTY mode** ▶ Select the mode required

TTY (full mode) See the call as text and hear it as audio.

TTY HCO Hear what the other person is saying, reply by entering text
TTY VCO See as text what the other person is saying, reply by speaking

## **Network-dependent settings**

You can, depending on your mobile network operator, use additional network services such as a mailbox, Call divert and Call waiting. You can set up, and enable and disable as required, these services from the Settings menu in the Phone app.

The call log shows all outgoing, accepted and missed calls.

You can use the Contacts app to enter and organise all information on your contacts, such as different numbers, address, mail address and much more. Other apps, such as the Phone app, access the information and make it available where it is needed.

### Editing the ME entry

The first entry in the contact list is called **Me**. This is where you define details about yourself. If you have already entered a name for personalising your smartphone when getting started, this name is assigned to the **Me** entry.

You can add more information to this name.

From the Status bar, use two fingers to swipe down . . . The quick settings are displayed ▶ Tap
 the sicon ▶ = Enter the details ▶ Tap

or

▶ Contacts ► Select the Me entry ► Tap ► Edit the contact ► Tap

# Messages (SMS/MMS)

To send and receive messages, use the **Messaging** app. It is in the Favourites bar on the start screen by default (→ p. 20).

Instead of using **Messaging** as the standard app for sending and receiving messages, use **Hangouts**:

# Sending and replying to messages



Sometimes apps send text messages using billable Premium services. Android detects every attempt by an app to send an SMS in your name. A warning is displayed when there is a suspicion that an SMS entails additional charges. Text messages can be discarded, or sent anyway, in these cases.

### Writing an SMS

A text message (SMS) can comprise a maximum of 160 characters. If you enter more characters, the message is sent in several sub-messages (if this function is supported by your mobile network operator).

- ▶ **Messaging** ... The list of conversations is displayed ▶ Tap
- Enter the phone number, name or email address ... Whilst you are doing so, possible
  matching contacts from the contact list are suggested Tap a suggestion or continue with
  your entry

or

- Tap ★ ... The contact list is opened Select one or more contacts to whom to send the message OK
- Tap Type text message Enter the message text

### Inserting a Smiley (Emoticon)

Whilst entering text, tap in the bottom right of the keypad ► Select icon

Back to the keypad: ▶ Tap ABC

### Saving a message as a draft

▶ Whilst entering a text message, tap ← ... The message is stored in the list of conversations as a draft

Continue with entry: > Tap this conversation.

### Writing an MMS

A multimedia message (MMS) can contain text, a picture, a recorded voice message, an audio file, a video, a slide show with images, a contact or an appointment.

♦ Select the required attachment ...

#### **Pictures**

... The pictures taken recently are displayed > Select picture

#### Capture picture

... The Camera app opens > Take a picture and attach it

#### Videos

... The videos recorded recently are displayed \( \bar{\bar} \) Select a video

#### Capture video

... The Camera app opens > Record a video and attach it to the message

#### Record audio

... The Sound recorder opens Record the voice message

#### Slideshow

... The screen for editing the slide show opens  $\blacktriangleright$  Tap slide  $\blacktriangleright$  Make a slide Put together a slide show of up to 10 slides using the text, photos, videos and audio recordings.

#### Contact

... The contact list opens ▶ Select a contact ▶ **OK** ... The contact is appended as a vcf file

#### Calendar

... The appointment list of the calendar opens **>** Select an appointment **> OK** ... The appointment is appended as a vcf file

The file appended is displayed in the message. Buttons enable you to show a preview of the media attachments, replace files and delete files.



When media attachments from several apps are shown, e.g. images in **Photos** or **Gallery**:

▶ Tap = in the top left ▶ Select app

## Sending a message

▶ Write a text or multimedia message ▶ Tap ➤ ... The message is sent

Back to the list of conversations: ▶ Tap ←

The message is the start of a conversation. It is stored in the message list under the name or phone number of the recipient. Responses from the message recipient are displayed in the same conversation.

## Responding to received messages

When a new message arrives, you receive a notification and the 🛂 icon is shown in the Notifications bar.

or

- Messaging ... The list of conversations is displayed ▶ Tap the new conversation
- Enter the reply ► Tap >

### What to do with multimedia messages

If the Auto-retrieve option in MMS settings is disabled:







## Power management

To prolong the life of your smartphone as long as possible, the device has various ways to make best possible use of the battery capacity. Use the **Battery Manager** app to optimise power consumption.



Access to the information and a few settings is also possible from:



## Showing the battery charge level

The icon in the Status bar shows the charge level ( p. 84).

Showing the charge level next to the battery icon in %:

► From the Status bar, use two fingers to swipe down ► Tap the battery icon ► Enable/ disable Battery Percentage with the switch

## Showing the power consumption

- ▶ **(i)** Battery Manager . . . The current charge level (as %) and the expected usage time remaining are shown
- ▶ Power consumption list ... Consumption since the device was last fully charged, and the consumption (as %) of various system components (system, system in idle mode, display lighting and WLAN), are shown graphically

Show more information on system component consumption: Tap the entry



When the device is being charged, the remaining time to charge level "Full" is shown instead of the usage time remaining.

# **Using Power Save mode**

Save power until the device can be charged again.

Some of the device's functions are limited in Power Save mode:

- Google Maps Navigation cannot be used.
- The vibration function, location services and most background data are restricted.
- Email, SMS/MMS and other apps requiring the synchronisation function are only updated when opened.

Enabling/disabling Power Save mode:



When Power Save mode is enabled, the upper and lower areas of the screen are shown in orange.

Power Save mode ends automatically when the device is being charged.

### **Using Intelligent Power Save mode**

In Intelligent Power Save mode, unused peripherals are disabled and system performance is optimised.

Selecting components for power saving:

▶ Tap the arrow next to Smart power saving mode ▶ Enable/disable the functions with the switches and set the process limit

Enabling Intelligent Power Save mode:

▶ Tap Smart power saving mode ▶ Confirm

Disabling Intelligent Power Save mode:

▶ Tap Normal mode

### **Using Super Power Save mode**

In Super Power Save mode, access to the **Phone**, **Contacts**, **Messages** and **Clock** apps is restricted, the brightness is reduced and graphics on the start screens are minimised.

or

From the Status bar, swipe down using two fingers ... The quick settings are opened ▶ Tap the icon

Ending Super Power Save mode: ▶ Tap <

## Optimising the battery life

When battery power optimisation is enabled, apps are disabled when you are not using the device or have not used the apps for a few days. Apps are enabled again once they are used. Battery power optimisation is enabled by default.

Enabling battery power optimisation:

▶ Tap an app ▶ Select option Optimize ▶ Done

Show all apps: Tap the down arrow Tap All apps ... All apps are shown



Battery power optimisation is not available for some important services because correct functioning of the device is then not guaranteed.

## Other power and resource consumption settings

#### **Auto-start management**

Select the apps which may / may not be started automatically on system start

### Clean up background processes when in standby

Select the apps for which background information is deleted when you switch to standby mode

### Clear background app

Select the apps which may / may not be started in the background

#### Night mode

At night, switch the mobile mode to 2G only. Select the time period for the switchover.

#### Power saving alert: low battery

Issue a notification when the battery has reached a low charge level.

#### Select critical value

Set the value for the low charge level using the slider bar.

#### Switch when battery is low

Set which Power Save mode is enabled when the low charge level is reached.

## Storage

The device differentiates between permanent device storage (which can be extended with an SD card) and main memory. The permanent storage area is for data such as music and photos. Main memory is temporary storage used by the device to run apps and the overall system.

# Device storage management without SD card

Check the available storage capacity and memory usage of apps.

Show more information: Tap an entry

### Device storage management with SD card



The device detects SD cards with a storage capacity of 32 GB. Higher capacity cards (to 128 GB) can be used if formatted on the GS160 (not from a PC).

Your device might not work perfectly if not enough main memory is available.

Displaying main memory usage:

# **Accessibility features**

For those with disabilities, there are a number of useful settings for adapting the usage of the smartphone to personal needs.

▶ ☼ Settings ▶ System – Accessibility ▶ Enable/disable or set up the required function

#### Talk Back

Enable spoken feedback for users with impaired vision. The device describes the controls the user touches.

#### Captions

Enable subtitles for the device, and configure settings for voice, text size and subtitle style.

### Magnification gestures

Use enlargement movements to temporarily increase the size of content on the screen.

#### Large text

Use a larger font for text on the display.

#### High contrast text

Use black or white as the text colour depending on the original text colour.

#### Power button ends call

End calls by pressing the On/Off button.

#### Auto-rotate screen

Automatically switch between landscape or portrait view when the smartphone is rotated.

#### Speak passwords

When entering passwords, receive spoken feedback from TalkBack.

Enabled: Password characters are spoken out so as to be audible, just like all other entered characters.

Disabled: Password characters can only be heard over a headset.

#### **Accessibility shortcut**

Quickly enable TalkBack without looking at the screen.

If the Accessibility shortcut is enabled, start TalkBack as follows:

▶ Keep the On/Off button pressed until you hear a tone or the device vibrates ▶ Use two fingers to touch and hold the screen until a confirmation signal sounds.

#### Text-to-speech output

Configure comprehensive settings for speech output.

#### Touch & hold delay

Change the time after which "Touch and hold" is enabled on touching the screen.

#### Color inversion

Swapping of colour values. For example, black text on a white screen becomes white text on a black screen.

#### Color correction

Compensate the effects of colour blindness.

# Security

## Display lock

The display lock protects the device from unauthorised use. When you switch the device on or enable the display, you are prompted to unlock the device.

The display lock becomes active after a defined time after the device has switched to idle mode. A pattern, PIN or password is used as the display lock.



It is also possible to use a fingerprint as a display lock ( p. 29). In this case, the display lock set up serves as the alternative method.

Setting up a display lock when getting started (→ p. 13).

# Settings for the display lock

## Entering a lock screen message

Enter the text to be displayed when the screen lock is enabled, such as your name and address, or an emergency message. All those picking up the phone can read the message without unlocking the smartphone.

▶ (a) Settings > Users - Security > Lock screen message > (a) Enter text > Save

## Showing/hiding the pattern

Only for a display lock with pattern. When entering the pattern to unlock the device, the pattern is shown as a line by default. You are able to change this for security reasons.

▶ ☼ Settings ▶ Users – Security ▶ Enable/disable the switch next to Make pattern visible

### Setting the time for automatic display lock

The display lock is enabled once the device has been in idle mode for a certain time.

▶ (a) Settings ▶ Users – Security ▶ Automatically lock ▶ Select the duration of idle mode

### Enabling the display lock when switching on and off



The settings for **Automatically lock** and **Power button instantly locks** can be cancelled with Smart Lock.

## Automatically unlocking the device with Smart Lock

Smart Lock enables the smartphone to be unlocked automatically under certain circumstances, such as when you have it on you or are at home.



Smart Lock must be enabled in Trust agents:

# Screen pinning

When you pass on the smartphone to someone else, you can restrict its usage to a single app. For this, you pin a certain view of this app.

# **Enabling/disabling screen pinning**

- ▶ ② Settings ▶ Users Security ▶ Advanced Screen pinning ▶ Enable/disable the function with the switch
- Use the switch to specify whether the PIN, pattern or password needs to be entered to unpin the screen.

# Pinning the screen

Open the screen to be pinned ▶ Tap the Navigation button ▶ Swipe up until you can see the ↓ pin icon ▶ Tap the icon ▶ OK

# Unpinning the screen

Touch and hold at the same time the ◀ and □ Navigation buttons ► Enter the PIN, pattern or password as required ... The screen is unpinned

### Protection in the event of theft

If your smartphone is stolen, you are able to lock it and delete personal data remotely. For this, specify as emergency contacts the phone number(s) of one or more different smartphones, such as those of friends and family members. When the SIM card in your smartphone is swapped out, the emergency contact(s) receive(s) a message requesting the new phone number of the sender to be saved. You can also arrange for SMS messages to be sent automatically to the smartphone via the emergency contacts, which trigger the following actions:

- · Locking of the smartphone
- Deleting of personal data
- · Resetting of anti-theft PIN

### Configuring theft protection

- ► Tap ✓ ► Next
- ▶ Select option Reset remote control commands via SMS to emergency contacts ▶ Done

## Changing/disabling theft protection

▶ ② Settings ▶ Users – Security ▶ Mobile anti-theft protection ▶ ■ Enter the anti-theft PIN ... The current settings are displayed

To change the setting:

- ▶ Tap the required setting ▶ Change  **▶ Done**
- Disabling theft protection:
- ▶ Tap Turn mobile anti-theft protection off ▶ OK

### SIM card lock

The SIM card lock prevents unauthorised use of the device. For every locked SIM card, the PIN must be entered when the device is started.

The PIN lock is enabled when the device is purchased. The PIN is available from your mobile network operator.

▶ ② Settings ▶ Users – Security ▶ Set up SIM card lock ▶ When there are two SIM cards, select the provider of the SIM card from the header

Enabling/disabling the SIM card lock:

▶ Enable/disable the switch next to Lock SIM card ▶ Enter the valid PIN ▶ OK

Changing the PIN:

▶ Change SIM PIN ▶ Enter the valid PIN ▶ OK ▶ Enter the new 4-digit PIN ▶ OK

# App permissions

When downloading an app from Google Play, specify the functions and data to which this app has access, e.g. to contacts or your location.

You can check and change permissions for apps on your device. With App permissions management, you have quick access to all permissions granted to apps on the device.

## Permissions when installing apps

Many apps downloaded from Play Store request access to particular information before installation. For apps developed for Android 6.0 and higher, you can grant or deny permissions on initial use.

Information on app permissions in the Google Play Store:

- On the "Permissions" screen for an app in the Play Store, you can check which permissions
  the app requires and then decide whether you want to install it. Scroll down to the very end
  of the app description.
- For many apps, all permissions are displayed in Google Play before installation. You can use this information to decide whether you want to install the apps.
- Some apps are installed without any prompts about permissions. You are then able to grant or deny individual permissions when using the apps for the first time.
- Permissions might be changed when apps are updated automatically. When using for the
  first time a function which requests a new permission, you might have to grant or deny
  access to this data or function.
- If you want to check all updates before an installation, disable the automatic updates option in the Play Store.

For certain apps: In the menu under My apps and games

For all apps: In the menu under Settings

# Enabling/disabling permissions for apps on the smartphone

▶ **(a)** Settings ▶ Device – Apps ... All installed apps are listed

Setting the permissions for an app:

▶ Select the app for which you want to change the permissions ▶ Permissions ... All meaningful permissions for the app are displayed ▶ Grant/deny the required permissions with the switch

Displaying all permissions in detail:

▶ Tap ▶ All permissions

Setting all apps with certain permissions:

Tap → App permissions ... All possible permissions are displayed → Select a permission → Grant/deny a permission for the required apps with the switch



If you revoke or do not grant permissions for an app, it might not work properly.

### Checking and managing permissions

App permissions management provides you a quick overview of all permissions. Specify for every app whether a permission is granted always (Always allow), never (Always deny) or only on request (Always ask).

Enabling/disabling app permissions management:

Displaying detailed information on app permissions:

Permissions and assigned apps:

- ... In **Permissions**, all permission groups are displayed, each with the number of apps using a permission
- ▶ Tap a permission group ... All apps using this permission are listed
- ▶ Tap an app ▶ Select whether the app is granted this permission always, never or only on request

Apps and assigned permissions:

- ... In Apps, all apps are displayed, each with the number of permissions they are using
- ▶ Tap an app ... All permissions for the app are listed ▶ Tap permission ▶ Select whether this app permission is granted always, never or only on request



If App permissions management is enabled, the a icon is displayed in the Notifications bar. You can also open App permissions management from the notification.

# **Android Device Manager**

If you have lost your smartphone, you can use the Android Device Manager to locate it, ring it, lock it and delete data on it.



The device is registered with a Google account ( p. 63)

Location detection is enabled ( p. 65).

Enabling/disabling monitoring by the Android Device Manager:

▶ ② Settings ▶ Users – Google ▶ Security ▶ Enable/disable the Remotely locate this device and Allow remote lock and erase functions with the switch

Check whether the Android Device Manager can locate the device:

 Log in to your Google account on <u>android.com/devicemanager</u> and see whether your device is displayed



You can also install the Android Device Manager on mobile devices, such as your smartphone or a tablet (downloaded from Google Play).

### **Device administrators**

Device administrators are apps authorised to create a connection to your smartphone and to exchange data, for synchronisation for example. You can authorise this by setting up an account hosted by a business service, such as for an email, calendar or business app.

▶ ② Settings ▶ Users – Security ▶ Device administrators ... A list of device administrators is displayed ▶ Tick the checkboxes next to the apps to be allowed as device administrators

Displaying device administrator information:

▶ Touch and hold a service in the list



If you disable a device administrator, you revoke the permission of associated services to synchronise data on your phone.

Google services (Gmail, contacts, calendar, etc.) are not treated as device administrators. Permissions for these services to make changes on the smartphone are managed from the Google account settings.

### Certificates

Digital certificates are used to identify your smartphone in secure network connections. You require a certificate for VPN or WLAN connections for example, or for authentication with email servers, browsers or other apps. Some certificates are already stored on your phone by default. You can install further certificates.

#### Supported formats:

- DER coded X 509 certificates with file extensions CRT and CER.
- X.509 certificates in PKCS#12 keystore files with file extensions .P12 and .PFX. If you install a
  certificate from a PKCS#12 keystore file, the corresponding private key certificates or
  certification authority (CA) certificates are also installed.

Files with different file extensions cannot be installed. Change the file extension if required.

# **Managing certificates**

▶ (a) Settings ▶ Users – Security ▶ Trusted credentials

The installed certificates are displayed.

System: Contains all certificates issued by a certification authority (CA) that are permanently

installed in the write-protected memory of your phone.

**User:** Contains all CA certificates you have installed yourself, when installing a client

certificate for example.

If a certificate is corrupt or you do not trust a certificate, you can disable or delete it.

▶ Tap a certificate ... Information on the certificate is displayed ▶ Scroll down

System certificate: Disable/Enable OK

User certificate: ▶ Remove ▶ OK ... The certificate is deleted permanently and needs to be reinstalled if required

# Installing client and CA certificates

Install additional certificates from an SD card, internal storage, the Download folder or Google Drive.

- ▶ Save a certificate or keystore file on one of the media mentioned above.
- ▶ (a) Settings ▶ Users Security ▶ Install from SD card ▶ Open the = menu ▶ Select the certificate location > Tap the file name of the required certificate or keystore > Enter the keystore password ▶ **OK** ▶ Enter the certificate name ▶ **OK**

CA certificates upon which client certificates are based are also installed.



A display lock with high security level must be set (with PIN or password) if you want to install certificates. You might be prompted to set a display lock ( p. 57).

# Accounts and location detection

#### Accounts

Use one or more accounts to use personal information such as contacts, pictures and mailbox on multiple devices. An account enables synchronisation of the information and makes it available to all registered devices.

### Account types

### Google account

You need a Google account for Google services such as Gmail™, Google+™ or YouTube™, and for downloading apps from Google Play™. When you log in with a Google account, emails, contacts, appointments and other information assigned to this account are automatically synchronised with your device. You can set up a new account on the smartphone or log in the smartphone to an existing account.

#### **Email account**

If you do not use the Google account for your email, you need to register your smartphone with your mail server, POP3 and IMAP mail servers are supported.

You can still use the **Gmail** app to receive and send emails.

Managing emails with the **Gmail** app: **\rightarrow** Use an account type with icon



Managing emails with the **Email** app: Use an account type with icon





You require information on the service the account uses, such as server address, user name and password. The phone must be able to establish an Internet connection over WLAN.

#### Exchange account

You set up an Exchange account to synchronise contacts, calendar, tasks and emails with Microsoft Outlook™.

## Adding an account

▶ ② Settings ▶ Personal – Accounts ▶ Add account ▶ Tap the type of account you want to add ▶ Enter the account details. Follow the instructions on the screen

## Removing an account



When an account is removed from a device, all associated content is also removed, such as emails, contacts and settings.

▶ to Settings ▶ Personal – Accounts ▶ Tap the account to be deleted ▶ Tap ★ Remove account

# Synchronising

You can specify how apps synchronise messages, emails and other current data in your Google account.

Google apps are automatically synchronised with the Google account as standard. You can enable and disable automatic synchronisation for individual Google apps.



Apps which are not from Google cannot be synchronised using a Google account. Look in the respective settings menu for these apps for a synchronisation option.

## **Enabling/disabling automatic synchronisation**

Setting synchronisation for individual apps:

▶ ② Settings ▶ Personal – Accounts ▶ Google ▶ Select an account if several are set up ... A list of Google apps with the time of most recent synchronisation is displayed ▶ Enable/disable synchronisation of an app with the relevant switch

Setting synchronisation for a Google account:



Disabling automatic synchronisation prolongs the battery life. Enable automatic synchronisation again if you want to continue after charging the battery.

# Manually synchronising an account

In manual synchronisation, the data of all Google apps is updated, including all apps with automatic synchronisation disabled.

### Location detection

Apps with **Location detection** permission can use the device's location information to offer location-specific services, such as check-in options, traffic information and nearby restaurants.

## **Enabling/disabling location detection**

From the Status bar, swipe down using two fingers . . . The quick settings are displayed Tap



### Changing location mode

Different sources for location detection of the device are used depending on mode.

- High accuracy
  - GPS, WLAN, mobile networks and other sensors are used to determine the location of your device as accurately as possible.
- · Battery saving

The device determines its location using sources which require little power, such as WLAN and mobile networks.

· Device only

Only GPS is used. The location service from Google is not used. This mode potentially requires more power and is slower.

Location detection enabled:

▶ @ Settings ▶ Personal – Location ▶ Mode ▶ Select the mode

## Checking location detection by apps

Check which apps are currently accessing your location, or have recently accessed your location.

▶ **(iii)** ► **(iii)** Settings ► Personal – Location . . . In Recent location requests is a list of apps which have recently accessed the location of the device. Information on battery usage is also provided.

### Managing location history

When **Location history** is enabled, Google can also determine the device's location when no Google app is active. Location history information is stored in your Google account for all devices assigned to the account.

▶ m ▶ sign Settings ▶ Personal – Location ▶ Google-Location History

or

▶ 🜐 ▶ 🔯 Settings ▶ Personal – Google ▶ Location ▶ Google-Location History

The screen is the starting point for all activities pertaining to the location history. You can for example switch off the location history for individual or all devices, view locations visited over a certain period, show information on locations visited or delete all your location history information.

# **Apps**

# **Default app**

If you have several apps with identical functions, you can select which app is used as standard for an action. For example, if you have downloaded from Google Play a different calendar or another app for making calls, you can make these the default apps.

## Selecting a default app for an action

If multiple apps are available for an action and a default app is not defined, you are prompted to select an app.

- ▶ Tap the app you want to use.
- Select whether this app is used Just once or Always for the action.

If you select Always, the app is set as the default app for all actions of this type.

## Resetting the default app

▶ m > possible properties
▶ Settings
▶ Device – Apps . . . All installed apps are listed
▶ Select the app for which Always was selected before for an action
▶ Open by default
▶ Clear defaults



If you then restart the action, you are prompted again as to which app to use.

# Specifying the default app for a frequently used function

For the following functions, you can select a default app at any time without performing a relevant action: Assist & voice input, Browser app, Phone app, SMS app.

▶ m > m Settings > Device - Apps > Tap > Default Apps > Select function > ... If there are several apps for this function, they are displayed > Select app

## Changing app settings

Check the current app settings and change them as required.

Which settings are available depends on the respective app.

#### Uninstall / Disable

Uninstall app from device / disable app → p. 25

#### Force stop

Stops the app including all background processes. This is a sensible action when an app no longer responds for example, or is running in the background and is using too many system resources (such as memory). The app can easily be started again from the App menu.

#### Storage

Internal storage used by the app.

Freeing up storage: Tap Storage Clear data

Freeing up temporary app memory: ▶ Tap Storage ▶ Clear cache

#### Data usage

Data volume downloaded or uploaded by the app over the mobile data network or WLAN  $(\rightarrow p.73)$ .

#### **Permissions**

Apps and system resources the app is permitted to access (→ p. 60)

#### Notifications

Specify the procedure for app notifications ( p. 23)

### Open by default

Specify how the app is to proceed with links.

### **Battery**

Battery usage since the last full charge ( p. 52).

#### Memory

Average memory usage in the device's temporary main memory over the last three hours  $(\rightarrow p. 52)$ .



More settings are in the respective app in menu **Settings**. Access to the settings is dependent on the app, from **=** or the **t**icon.

# **General app settings**

Checking and changing the permissions and default values for apps.



### App permissions

Granting and revoking app permissions ( p. 60).

#### App links

Specify how apps are to proceed with links.

### **Default Apps**

If several apps with identical function are available, select which one is used by default  $(\rightarrow p. 67)$ .

#### Draw over other apps

Show the apps which are placed over other open apps when started.

#### Modify system settings

Show the apps authorised to change system settings.

#### **Battery optimization**

Shows the apps which do not have power optimisation ( $\Rightarrow$  p. 53).

Showing the details for a setting or changing a setting: Tap the required setting

## Resetting app settings

Reset all the changes made to app settings.

### Network connections


The smartphone can establish connections to mobile networks, WLANs and other devices via Rluetooth

### Mobile networks

To make and receive calls with the smartphone over a mobile network, you require a SIM card from the relevant mobile network operator. Refer to your mobile contract for which services are available, and which terms and conditions apply.

You can insert two SIM cards into your device (→ p. 10), i.e. you can use two mobile networks at the same time

### **Editing settings**





If two SIM cards are inserted into the device, the **Mobile network settings** screen contains a tab for each SIM card **>** Select the appropriate tab as required.

#### Data roaming

Permit the sending of data by the device over mobile networks of other operators whilst you are in a region where the network of your operator is not available.



Additional charges can be incurred by data roaming (depending on your mobile contract).

#### Preferred networks

Select a preferred mobile network when you are not in the area of your mobile network operator.

#### Preferred network type

Select the preferred mobile standard, such as LTE, 3G or 2G. The smartphone uses the network with the best availability as standard.

#### **Enhanced 4G LTE Mode**

Improve speech quality and other communication.

#### Access point names

Your mobile network operator can use these settings to determine the correct IP address for your device, and so establish a secure connection for your device.

#### Cellular networks

Select your network operator from the networks available.

### Using two SIM cards

▶ ☼ Settings ▶ Wireless & networks – SIM cards ... Detected SIM cards in slots 1 and 2 are displayed

Enabling and disabling a SIM card: ▶ Enable/disable the switch

#### Showing information:

▶ Tap an entry . . . The name of the SIM card, the colour used for the card, the mobile network operator and the phone number are displayed. You can change the name and display colour.

Specify the preferred SIM card for the following functions:

Cellular data

Only one SIM card can be used for mobile data transmission.

Calls

You can specify one SIM card for all outgoing calls, or be prompted for which SIM card to use before every call.

SMS messages

One SIM card can be defined for sending SMS messages.



You might need to perform the assignment anew when you insert a new SIM card or swap out an existing one.

### **WLAN**

Use the smartphone to establish a connection to a WLAN, and use the connection to send data and to surf the Internet.

A connection is established automatically if the smartphone is within range of a registered WLAN and the WLAN function is enabled.

# **Enabling/disabling the WLAN function**

► From the Status bar, swipe down using two fingers . . . The quick settings are displayed ► Tap the WLAN icon

or

▶ ☼ Settings ▶ Wireless & networks – Wi-Fi ▶ Disable/enable WLAN with the On/Off switch

When WLAN is enabled, the vicon is displayed in the Status bar. The icon shows the signal strength on four levels. Little arrows in the icon show when data is being sent.



To prolong the battery life, disable the WLAN function when you are not using it. WLAN is disabled in Flight mode.

### Establishing a connection to a WLAN

► From the Status bar, swipe down using two fingers . . . The quick settings are displayed ► Tap the arrow under the WLAN icon

or

- ▶ 🗰 ▶ 🔯 Settings ▶ Wireless & networks Wi-Fi
- ... All WLANs within range are displayed.

Networks protected by a password have a lock next to the con. Networks without a lock icon are public hot spots.

▶ Tap the required WLAN ▶ ■ Enter the network password ▶ Connect . . . If the connection is successful, Connected is displayed under the network name

WLANs registered for the smartphone are shown in the **Saved networks** list, even if they are currently out of range and no connection is established.

Showing saved WLANs: ▶ Tap ▶ Saved networks

### Adding more WLANs

WLANs which do not send their name (the SSID) or are not within range are not displayed in the WLAN list. They can still be saved with name and password. The connection is established if the WLAN is within range.

▶ ★ Settings ▶ Wireless & networks – Wi-Fi ▶ Tap ★ Add a network ▶ ■ Enter the network name (SSID) and security details ▶ Save ... The network is included in the Saved networks list

## Removing a WLAN

If the requirement is for the device to not automatically connect to a saved WLAN, the WLAN can be removed from the list of saved networks.

# Viewing WLAN details

Changing the network settings:

▶ Touch and hold the network name ▶ Modify network

Deleting a network: Forget network

### Connection configuration

Align the network settings to the requirements of the WLAN to be used to establish a connection.

### Proxy

If a connection to a WLAN is established over a proxy: Tap Proxy

Manually entering the proxy details: Manual Enter the details Save

Automatic proxy configuration: ▶ Autom. proxy config. ▶ ■ Enter the URL of a PAC file ▶ Save



A Proxy Auto Config (PAC) file enables a web browser to automatically find the right proxy server for a required URL.

#### DHCP

When there is no active DHCP server in the WLAN: ▶ Tap DHCP ▶ Static ▶ I Enter the network configuration details ▶ Save

### **Advanced options**

► Select option • Mireless & networks – Wi-Fi • Tap

Show a notification when the device finds a WLAN to which a connection can be established.

▶ Enable/disable the function with the switch next to **Network notification** 

The WLAN connection has a high power requirement. Specify how the WLAN connection proceeds when the device is in sleep mode.

▶ Keep Wi-Fi on during sleep ▶ Select the desired option

Digital certificates are used to identify the device for WLAN access. You can install additional certificates if not all those required are available.

▶ Install certificates ▶ Select the source for the certificate

Certificates > p. 62

Establish a connection between the device and other Wi-Fi Direct-enabled devices.

 Wi-Fi Direct ... WiFi Direct-enabled devices or groups within range are displayed ► Select the required device or group

Registration at a WLAN Access Point with the WPS Push function.

▶ WPS Push Button ▶ Enable WPS Push function at the Access Point ... The connection is established

Registration at a WLAN Access Point with personal identification number (PIN).

WPS Pin Entry . . . The WPS PIN of the device is displayed ▶ Enter WPS PIN at the Access Point . . . The connection is established

### Information on the device's WLAN interface

The screen shows the current MAC address, IP address and IP-V6 address of the device

## Data usage

The data usage is the amount of data uploaded or downloaded by the device over a certain period over the mobile data connection or WLAN. Most tariffs include a restriction of data volume. So as not to incur any additional costs, you can check the data usage of the device and change it as required.

## Checking data usage

▶ **(a)** Settings ▶ Wireless & networks – Data usage

Displayed in **Cellular** is the data volume sent so far in the current month for every SIM card inserted.

Displayed in Wi-Fi is the data volume sent over the WLAN for the current day and month.

Showing further information, such as the apps involved in data usage:

▶ In the header, tap the name of a mobile network operator or Wi-Fi ► Scroll down to show the apps

### Setting a limit and warning for data usage

▶ ② Settings ▶ Wireless & networks – Data usage ▶ In the header, tap the name of a mobile network operator ▶ Enable the function with the switch next to Set cellular data limit ... The data volume agreed with the mobile network operator is entered in the graphic. Data usage is disabled automatically when the limit is reached. You receive a notification.

Setting a limit for the warning:

▶ In the graphic, touch the **Warning** line and drag it to the required position . . . You receive a notification when the data volume reaches the set value

Re-enabling data usage:

Disable the function again with the switch next to Set cellular data limit



Data transmission can now incur costs.

## Enabling/disabling mobile data connection

When you disable data transmission over the mobile network, actions with high data usage (such as updating apps) are only performed when there is a connection to a WLAN.

From the Status bar, swipe down using two fingers . . . The quick settings are displayed ▶ Tap

or

▶ ② Settings ▶ Wireless & networks – Data usage ▶ In the header, tap the name of a mobile network operator ▶ Enable/disable data transmission with the switch next to Cellular data

### Other ways to reduce data usage

#### Disabling automatic synchronisation

When automatic synchronisation is enabled, the data of apps is updated automatically (such as contacts or appointments).

Disabling automatic synchronisation:

### Restricting the use of background data

▶ \$\oint\_{\infty}\$ \$\oint\_{\infty}\$

For all apps: ▶ Tap ▶ Restrict app background data ▶ OK

#### For individual apps:

 Scroll down ► Select the required app ...Data usage details are displayed ► Enable/disable the function with the switch next to Restrict app background data



Restricting background data can impact the performance of the app. For example, you receive no more notifications until the app is opened next.

### Disabling data roaming

If the network of your mobile network operator is not available, data roaming enables the device to use the networks of other operators.



Data roaming can entail additional costs, but is in some places the only way to establish an Internet connection.

### **Bluetooth**

Use the smartphone to establish a connection to a Bluetooth device.

If you are using a Bluetooth device for the first time, it must first be coupled with the smartphone by the Pairing process to enable a secure connection between the two devices. Then the connection is established automatically.

## **Enabling/disabling Bluetooth**

► From the Status bar, swipe down using two fingers . . . The quick settings are displayed ► Tap the ★ Bluetooth icon

or

► to Settings ► Wireless & networks – Bluetooth ► Disable/enable Bluetooth with the On/Off switch

When Bluetooth is enabled, the 🕻 icon is displayed in the Status bar.



The device can be seen by all nearby devices with Bluetooth function.

To prolong the battery life, disable the Bluetooth function when you are not using it. Bluetooth is disabled in Flight mode.

### **Pairing**

Before you can connect a phone or tablet to a Bluetooth device, you must perform a pairing between these devices. After a pairing is performed, the devices keep this status until the pairing is ended

▶ ② Settings ▶ Wireless & networks – Bluetooth ... Bluetooth devices available in the vicinity are displayed ▶ Tap the name of the required Bluetooth device ▶ Follow the subsequent instructions on the screen to complete the pairing ... If performed successfully, the device is included in the Paired devices list



If requested to enter a password, try the popular 0000 and 1234 passwords, or read the documentation for the Bluetooth device.

## Changing the names of connected Bluetooth devices or ending pairing

▶ ② Settings ▶ Wireless & networks – Bluetooth ▶ In the Paired devices list, tap ☆ next to the Bluetooth device

# Displaying data transmission information

# Flight mode

WLAN, mobile networks and Bluetooth are disabled in Flight mode.

 From the Status bar, swipe down using two fingers . . . The quick settings are displayed ▶ Tap the Flight mode icon

or

▶ to Settings ▶ Wireless & networks – More ▶ Airplane mode ▶ Enable/disable Flight Mode with the switch

or

▶ Press and hold the On/Off button ▶ Tap Airplane mode ▶ OK

When Flight mode is enabled, the 🛧 icon is displayed in the Status bar.

## Virtual Private Networks (VPN)

A Virtual Private Network (VPN) enables you to connect the smartphone to your private or a company network. When you are out and about and have access to a WLAN, use the VPN connection to surf free of eavesdroppers, to make free calls over your landline number, and to access your mailbox or data in the company network.



A VPN server is set up in the private or company network.

A VPN client is preinstalled on the smartphone. You need the configuration details of the VPN to set up a VPN connection.



You might require another VPN client for the VPN with which you want to connect the smartphone. Various VPN apps are available from the Google Play Store. Once you have installed a VPN app, configuration is done via the app.

## Adding a VPN

## Establishing a connection to a VPN

▶ ② Settings ▶ Wireless & networks – More ▶ VPN ... The VPNs set up are listed ▶ Select a VPN ▶ ■ Enter Username and Password ▶ Connect

Once the device is connected to a VPN, the Once is shown in the Status bar.

# **Ending a VPN connection**

From the Status bar, swipe down using two fingers . . . The quick settings are opened ▶ Next to Network may be monitored, tap the O→ icon ▶ Next to the VPN to be disconnected, tap
 Disconnect

## Deleting a VPN

▶ ② Settings ▶ Wireless & networks – More ▶ VPN ... The VPNs set up are listed ▶ Next to the VPN to be deleted, tap ② ▶ Forget

# **Editing VPN settings**



If you are using a VPN app, it is opened and you can make the required changes.

### Enabling/disabling "always-on" VPN

With some VPNs, the device remains always connected when the VPN connection is not active. This is a sensible option when moving between insecure public WLANs.

Enabling "always-on" VPN:

- ▶ When registering with a VPN, select option Save account information
- ► Tap Always-on VPN ► Select the VPN ► OK

You receive a notification that "always-on" VPN is enabled, and when the connection to an "always-on" VPN is down.

Disabling "always-on" VPN:

► Tap • Always-on VPN ► None ► OK



Once you have set up a VPN from an app, the option Always-on VPN is not displayed.

# Tethering with WLAN hotspot, Bluetooth or USB

With mobile WLAN hotspots, Bluetooth tethering and USB tethering, you can enable the data connection of the smartphone to other devices. For example, use a smartphone connection to surf the Internet with your notebook.



Using hotspot or tethering connections might entail additional charges. Contact your mobile operator as required.

Hotspots and tethering require high levels of battery power.

- ▶ Connect the smartphone to a power source when using hotspot and tethering.
- Disable hotspot and tethering when you do not need them.

# **Enabling and disabling WLAN hotspot**

Set up your own device as a WLAN hotspot.

▶ ★ Settings ▶ Wireless & networks – More ▶ Tethering & portable hotspot ▶ Wi-Fi hotspot ▶ Enable/disable the function with the switch

When the hotspot is enabled, the **(A)** icon is displayed in the Status bar.

The ((•)) icon is displayed in the Notifications bar. The number of connected and blocked users is displayed in the message.

# **Changing WLAN hotspot settings**

Change the network name, security, password and frequency band for access points.

▶ ② Settings ▶ Wireless & networks – More ▶ Tethering & portable hotspot ▶ Wi-Fi hotspot ▶ Set up Wi-Fi hotspot ▶ Change the required option ▶ Save

### Connecting a device to the WLAN hotspot

Showing the network name and password on the smartphone:

▶ ☼ Settings ▶ Wireless & networks – More ▶ Tethering & portable hotspot ▶ Wi-Fi hotspot ▶ Set up Wi-Fi hotspot ▶ Tap Show password ... The network name and password are displayed

Connecting to the hotspot on the other device:

 Open the list of WLANs within range ► Select network with the network name of the hotspot ► Enter the password for the hotspot ► Connect.

## Setting up and using Bluetooth tethering

Share the Internet connection with other devices via Bluetooth.



The mobile data connection is active → p. 73

- Carry out pairing between the smartphone and the device with which you want to share the Internet connection (→ p. 75)
- Set up the other device so that it establishes a network connection over Bluetooth. For more information, read the instructions for the device.

Enabling and disabling the Internet connection of the phone via Bluetooth tethering:
