

## How can I transfer ringtones to the phone with Gigaset QuickSync for MacOS?


You can select any clip of a music track or audio file that is not copy-protected and transfer this to your handset as a ringtone. All formats supported by the Mac (MP3, WAV, AIFF etc.) are also supported here.

- Click on the "Ringtones" tab to open the ringtone editor
- Drag the audio file from the Mac to the editor. You can drag music tracks directly from iTunes, for example

or

- Click on the "Photos" tab to open the file browser list
- Drag the audio file from the Mac to the list

The audio file is now displayed in the ringtone editor as a sound wave.



Click on the "playback" icon to start playback. You can set the volume and amplification of the sound wave via the sliders on the left and right-hand sides.

You can select the length of the required clip using the two blue triangles. To do this, move the triangles to the right or left. Use the slider on the right-hand side to amplify and refine the clip.

- Choose the clip you require by moving the blue triangular start and end markers underneath the sound wave
- Check the selected clip by starting playback and, if necessary, correcting the start and endpoints
- Click on "Send". The selected clip is now transferred to the handset and saved as a ringtone

**Please note**

Ringtones can only be transferred using a Gigaset SL78H, S79H or SL400H handset. As part of the transfer process, the ringtones are always converted and saved on your handset in 772 format.

Copy-protected music tracks cannot be transferred.

**Attention**

The handset must be in idle status for data transfers.
