### Procedures

**Example:** Switching Auto answer on/off:

- ▶ **MENU** ▶  **Settings** ▶ **OK** ▶  **Handset** ▶ **OK** ▶  **Auto Answer** ▶ **OK**  
 (✓ = enabled)

Step	Follow this procedure
▶ <b>MENU</b>	Press the display key <b>MENU</b> .
▶  <b>Settings</b>	Use the control key  to navigate to entry <b>Settings</b> .
▶ <b>OK</b>	Press <b>OK</b> to confirm. The submenu <b>Settings</b> opens.
▶  <b>Handset</b>	Select the <b>Handset</b> entry using the control key  .
▶ <b>OK</b>	Press <b>OK</b> to confirm. The submenu <b>Handset</b> opens.
▶  <b>Auto Answer</b>	Select the <b>Auto Answer</b> entry using the control key  .
▶ <b>OK</b>	Enable or disable it using <b>OK</b> . Function is enabled ✓.

## Safety precautions

	Read the safety precautions and the user guide before use.
	The device cannot be used in the event of a power failure. In case of a power failure it is also <b>not</b> possible to make <b>emergency calls</b> . Emergency numbers <b>cannot</b> be dialled if the <b>keypad/display lock</b> is activated!
	Use only <b>rechargeable batteries</b> that correspond to the <b>specification</b> (see list of permitted batteries → <a href="http://www.gigaset.com/service">www.gigaset.com/service</a> ). Never use a conventional (non-rechargeable) battery or other battery types as this could result in significant health risks and personal injury. Rechargeable batteries, which are noticeably damaged, must be replaced.
	The handset must not be operated if the battery cover is open. Ensure that the batteries can not be short-circuited by objects in the battery compartment.
	Do not use the devices in environments with a potential explosion hazard (e.g. paint shops).
	The devices are not splashproof. For this reason do not install them in a damp environment such as bathrooms or shower rooms.
	Use only the power adapter indicated on the device. Whilst charging, the power socket must be easily accessible.
	Remove faulty devices from use or have them repaired by our Service team, as these could interfere with other wireless services.
	Do not use the device if the display is cracked or broken. Broken glass or plastic can cause injury to hands and face. Send the device to our Service department to be repaired.
	Do not hold the rear of the handset to your ear when it is ringing or when speaker mode is activated. Otherwise you risk serious and permanent damage to your hearing. The phone may cause interference in analogue hearing aids (humming or whistling) or cause them to overload. If you require assistance, please contact the hearing aid supplier.
	Keep small cells and batteries, which can be swallowed, out of the reach of children. Swallowing a battery can lead to burns, perforation of soft tissue and death. Severe burns can occur within 2 hours of swallowing. In the case of a swallowed cell or battery, seek medical care immediately.
	To prevent loss of hearing, avoid listening at high volume over long periods of time.
	Using your telephone may affect nearby medical equipment. Be aware of the technical conditions in your particular environment, e.g. doctor's surgery. If you use a medical device (e.g. a pacemaker), please contact the device manufacturer. They will be able to advise you regarding the susceptibility of the device to external sources of high frequency energy (for the specifications of your Gigaset product see "Technical data").

# Getting started

## Package contents

- one base station
- one power adapter
- one handset
- one phone cable
- two batteries
- one battery cover
- one user guide



Position the base on a level, non-slip surface at a central point in the flat or house. You can also fit the base to a wall.

The range of the base is 300 metres outdoors and 50 metres indoors.

The base and the charging cradle are designed for use in enclosed, dry rooms within a temperature range of +5 °C to +45 °C.

The device's feet do not usually leave any marks on surfaces. However, due to the multitude of different varnishes and polishes used on furniture, contact marks on the surfaces cannot be completely ruled out.

Never expose the telephone to heat sources, direct sunlight or other electrical devices.

Protect your telephone from moisture, dust, corrosive liquids and vapours.

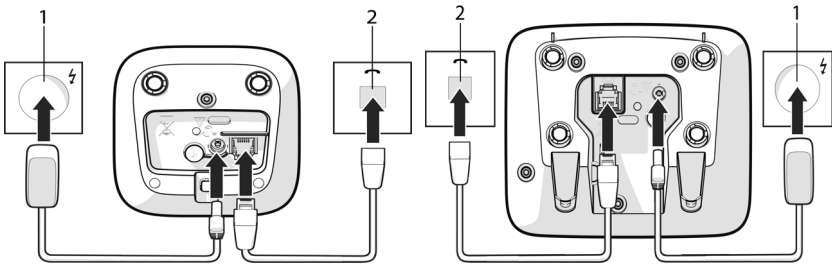
## Connecting the base station

### Connecting the base to power supply and telephone network

- ▶ Connect the power adapter **[1]**.
- ▶ Connect the phone jack **[2]** and insert the cables into the cable channels.

Device without answering machine

Device with answering machine



The power adapter must **always be connected** as the phone does not work without a power supply.

The answer machine (A170A/A270A only) will not be ready for operation until approximately 30 seconds after the base has been connected.

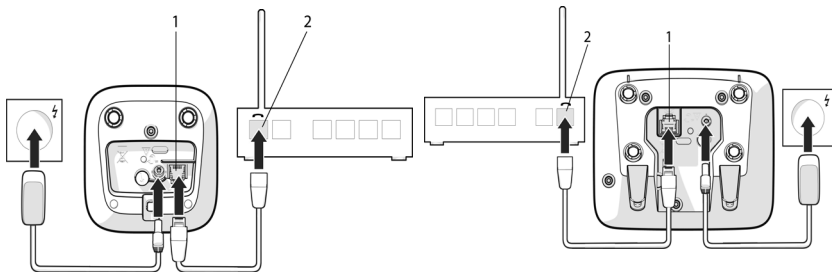
### Connecting the base to the router

You can also operate the telephone on the analogue connection of a router.

- ▶ Connect the phone jack **[1]** and connect it to the analogue port of a router **[2]**.

Device without answering machine

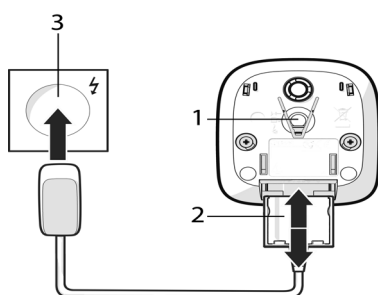
Device with answering machine



## Connecting the charger

- ▶ Connect the flat plug of the power adapter **2**.
- ▶ Plug the power adapter into the power socket **3**.

If you have to remove the plug from the charging cradle again: ▶ Press the release button **1** and disconnect the plug.



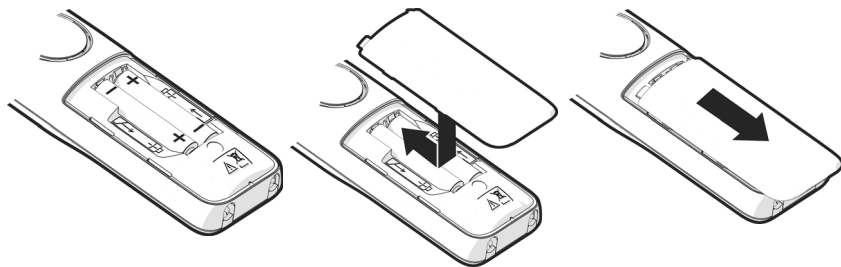
## Setting up the handset for use

The display is protected by a plastic film. **Please remove the protective film!**

## Inserting the batteries




Only use rechargeable batteries, as this could otherwise result in significant health risks and personal injury. For example, the outer casing of the batteries could be destroyed or the batteries could explode. The device could also malfunction or be damaged as a result of using batteries that are not of the recommended type.

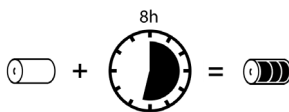


- ▶ Insert the batteries with the polarity in the correct direction. The polarity is indicated in the battery compartment.
- ▶ Insert the battery cover from the top.
- ▶ Then slide the cover upwards until it clicks into place.
- ▶ To open the battery cover, for instance to replace the batteries:
  - ▶ Reach into the notch at the top of the cover and slide the cover downwards.

## Charging the batteries

- ▶ Charge the batteries fully prior to first use in the base or the charging cradle.

The batteries are fully charged when the battery icon  on the display stops flashing.



Batteries may heat up during charging. This is not dangerous.

After a time, the charging capacity of the batteries will decrease for technical reasons.

Handsets contained in the package have already been registered to the base. If, however, a handset has not been registered (**Register HS** or **Put into base** is displayed), please register it manually (→ p. 31).

## Changing the display language

You can change the display language, if the telephone has been set to an incomprehensible language.

- 1 Press **OK** to enter the menu.
  - 2 Navigate to **HS SETTINGS**.
  - 3 Press **OK**.
  - 4 Navigate to **LANGUAGE**.
  - 5 Press **OK**.
  - 6 Select the language.
  - 7 Press **OK**.
- ▶ You set the language of your handset.

## Setting time and date

Set the date/time so that the correct date and time can be assigned to incoming calls, and to enable the alarm to be used.

- 1 Press **OK** to enter the menu.
- 2 Navigate to **HS SETTINGS**.
- 3 Press **OK**.
- 4 Navigate to **DATE & TIME**.
- 5 Press **OK**.
- 6 Navigate to **SET TIME**.
- 7 Press **OK**.
- 8 Enter the time.
- 9 Press **OK**.
- 10 Navigate to **SET YEAR**.
- 11 Enter the year.
- 12 Press **OK**.
- 13 Navigate to **SET DATE**.
- 14 Enter the date.

15 Press **OK**.

▶ You set the date and time.


Moving the input position to the left or the right: ▶ Press up or down on the control key .

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## Operating the handset

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### Switching the handset on and off


▶ Press and **hold** the End call key .

When you place a switched-off handset into the base or the charging cradle, it switches on automatically after about 30 seconds.

When the handset is removed from the base/charging cradle, the display switches off briefly.

### Locking/unlocking the keypad


▶ Press and **hold** the hash key .

---

### Menu navigation

Your phone has many functions, and they are available to you from menus.

Select menu function:

- 1 Press **OK** to enter the menu.
- 2 Navigate to the desired submenu using .
- 3 Press **OK** to select.


Return to idle status: ▶ Press and **hold** the key .

# Making calls

---


## Making a call

- 1 Enter the number.
- 2 Press the Talk key .
- ▶ The number is dialled.


or

- 1 Press and **hold** the Talk key .
- ▶ The dial tone can be heard.
- 2 Enter the number.

To change the receiver volume during a call:




- 1 Use  to set the volume.

To end call / cancel dialling:

- 1 Press the End call key .




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## Dialling from the directory

- 3 Press the Talk key .

## Dialling from the redial list

The list contains the 10 numbers last dialled with the handset.


- 1 Press the Talk key  **briefly**.
- 2 Select the entry.
- 3 Press the Talk key .

---

## Dialling from a direct memory key

- 1 Press and hold the direct memory key (1, 2 or 3).

## Accepting a call

- 1 Press the Talk key .

With function **AUTO ANSWER** enabled:

- 1 Take the handset out of the base/charging cradle.


Enabling function **AUTO ANSWER**:

- 1 Press **OK** to enter the menu.
- 2 Navigate to **HS SETTINGS**.
- 3 Press **OK**.
- 4 Navigate to **AUTO ANSWER**.
- 5 Press **OK**.
- 6 Select **ON** or **OFF**.
- 7 Press **OK**.

---

## Share a call

You can initiate a 3-way conversation on an active call.

- 1 Press **OK** during a call.
  - 2 Navigate to **INTERCOM**.
  - 3 Press the Talk key .
  - 4 Press and hold the star key.
- ▶ **CONFERENCE** displays on the handset.

---

## Place a call on hold

- 1 Press the R key to put the current call on hold.
- 2 Press the R key to switch between calls.

---

## Direct memory


There are three direct memory keys on the handset: dialling keys 1, 2 and 3. You can store a phone number into each of these keys and dial them directly when the phone is not in use.

- 1 Press **OK** to enter the menu.
- 2 Navigate to **HS SETTINGS**.
- 3 Press **OK**.
- 4 Navigate to **DIRECT MEM..**
- 5 Press **OK**.
- 6 Choose the **KEY**.
- 7 Press **OK**.
- 8 Enter the number.
- 9 Press **OK**.

## Directory

To open the directory:

- 1 Press down on the control key .

Phone numbers (max. 22 digits) with associated names (max. 14 characters) can be stored.

- 4 Select **VIP**.
- 5 Press **OK**.
- 6 Navigate to the desired entry.
- 7 Press **OK**.

- ▶ The VIP entry will be removed from the VIP list but will remain in the directory.



## Message/call lists

The telephone saves information about various events in lists:

- Call list: numbers of all incoming or missed calls
- Answer machine list (BASIC 100A): messages on the answer machine
- Network mailbox list: messages on the network mailbox



If calls are stored in the network mailbox, you receive a message when the setting is configured (dependent on the network provider).



### Call list

Depending on the list type setting, the call list contains the numbers of the most recent incoming or missed calls. If the call list is full, a new call will replace the oldest entry stored.



#### Setting the list type

- 1 Press **OK** to enter the menu.
- 2 Navigate to **CALL LIST**.
- 3 Press **OK**.
- 4 Press **OK**.
- 5 Navigate to **CATEGORY**.
- 6 Press **OK**.
- 7 Select **ALL CALLS** or **MISSED CALLS**.
- 8 Press **OK**.





## Block list

---

### Setting block mode

- 1 Press **OK** to enter the menu.
- 2 Navigate to **CALL BLOCKER**.
- 3 Press **OK**.
- 4 Navigate to **SETTINGS**.
- 5 Press **OK**.
- 6 Navigate to **BLOCK MODE**.
- 7 Press **OK**.

- 8 Choose between **BLOCK ALL** / **ALLOW VIP** / **BLOCK BLIST** / **OFF**.

**BLOCK ALL:** Blocks all unknown calls except numbers stored in the directory or VIP list.

**ALLOW VIP:** Blocks all calls not stored in the VIP list.

**BLOCK BLIST:** Blocks only numbers stored in the block list.

- 9 Press **OK**.

- 10 Choose between **ALWAYS ON** and **TIMED**.

**ALWAYS ON:** Block mode will be always on.

**TIMED:** Calls will only be blocked within the set time frame.

- 11 Enter the time to set the block mode.

- 12 Press **OK**.

- 13 Enter the time to turn off the block mode.

- 14 Press **OK**.

## Setting the type of calls to be blocked

**WITHHELD:** Blocks all calls that hide its caller ID.

**INTERNAT'L:** Blocks all international calls.

**UNAVAILABLE:** Blocks all calls without a caller ID.

**PAYPHONE:** Blocks all calls made from payphones.

- 9 Press **OK**.

- 10 Select **ON** or **OFF**.

- 11 Press **OK**.



You can set any or all of the four types of calls to be blocked.
