

Safety instructions

Please read the following information and instructions carefully. Failure to comply with these instructions may result in personal injury and damage to the device, as well as violations of applicable laws.

Please explain the content of this document as well as the potential risks involved when using the device to your children.

General information

- For your own safety, only use original Gigaset accessories or those approved by Gigaset for the mobile phone The use of accessories which are not compatible could damage the mobile phone and be the cause of hazardous situations. Original accessories can be obtained from Gigaset customer service (refer to Customer Service).
- The mobile phone is splashproof according to the IP44 standard. If your mobile
 phone has been exposed to water, dry it and the device openings (microphone/
 loudspeaker/USB Type-C port) with a lint-free cloth to remove any water droplets.
- Permissible temperature range for charging and operation: 0-40° C.
 High temperatures could reduce the service life of electronic devices, damage the battery or deform and melt plastic parts. If the mobile phone is to be used or stored in freezing areas, condensation could develop inside the phone and damage the electronic circuitry.
- The mobile phone must not be used or stored in dusty or dirty locations. Dust can be the cause of malfunction of the mobile phone.
- Switch off your mobile phone in potentially explosive atmospheres and observe all
 warnings. Potentially explosive atmospheres also include those locations for
 which it is normally recommended that vehicle engines be switched off. In such
 places, flying sparks can cause explosions or fires resulting in personal injury and
 possibly death.
 - These areas include: Petrol stations, chemical plants, transport or storage areas for hazardous chemicals, areas below deck on ships, areas in which the air contains chemical substances or fine particles (e.g. particles of dust or metal powder).
- Short-circuiting or modifying the mobile phone is prohibited there is a risk of personal injury, electric shock, fire or damage to the charger.

Battery and charging process

 To avoid battery fluid leakage, overheating, explosion or fire, never incinerate or heat batteries and never dispose of them in a fire or explosion-prone environment.
 Do not disassemble, weld or modify the battery. Do not store the battery in an environment subject to strong mechanical influences.

Safety instructions

- Do not use sharp objects, such as screwdrivers, to touch or puncture the battery.
 There is a risk of battery fluid leaking, the battery overheating, exploding or catching fire and burning. Crushing, heating or incinerating batteries is strictly prohibited.
- Eye contact with the battery electrolyte can cause blindness. If electrolyte enters the eyes, do not rub the eye with your hand. Immediately flush the affected eye completely with clean water and seek medical attention. There is a risk of skin burns if the electrolyte comes into contact with the skin (or clothing). Immediately rinse the skin or clothing completely with soap and clean water and seek medical attention if necessary.
- Never use the batteries for any purpose other than that specified. Never use a
 damaged battery. If the battery becomes hot, discoloured, deformed or leaks
 during use, charging or storage, you must replace the battery with a new one
 immediately for safety reasons.
- The temperature of the battery rises during charging. Do not store the battery in the same compartment as flammable products – there is a risk of fire.
- Do not charge the battery longer than 12 hours.
- Only charge the device indoors. During the charging process, do not hold any telephone conversations and do not dial any phone numbers.
- The electrical socket must be easily accessible during charging.
- There is a risk of electric shock during a thunderstorm.
- Do not use the charger if the power cable is damaged or there is no battery in the mobile phone – there is a risk of electric shock or a risk of fire in such cases.

Headphones



High volumes can damage hearing.

Listening to music or conversations through headphones at high volumes can be uncomfortable and cause permanent hearing damage. To prevent a loss of hearing, avoid listening at high volume levels for long periods of time.

- If you use the headphones while walking or running, please ensure that the headphone cable does not wrap around your body or other objects.
- Only use headphones in a dry environment. The static electricity which charges in the headphones could discharge on your ears causing an electric shock. Touching the headphone with your hand or contact with bare metal prior to connection to the mobile phone could cause static electricity to discharge.

Use in hospitals / Medical devices

- The function of medical devices could be impaired if used in the vicinity of your product. Observe the technical conditions in your environment, e.g. in medical practices.
- If you use a medical product (e.g. heart pacemaker), consult with the product
 manufacturer prior to use. They can provide information on the sensitivity of the
 device with regard to external, high-frequency power sources.
- Pacemakers, implanted cardioverter defibrillators:
 When switching on the mobile phone, please pay attention that the distance
 between the mobile phone and implant is at least 152 mm. To reduce potential
 interference, use the mobile phone on the opposite side to the implant. In the
 event of possible interference, please switch the mobile phone off immediately.
 Do not carry the mobile phone in a shirt pocket.
- Hearing aids, cochlea implants:
 Some digital, wireless devices can cause interference in hearing aids and cochlea implants. If interference occurs, please contact the manufacturer of such products.
- Other medical devices:
 If you and the people in your environment use other medical devices, please contact the relevant manufacturer as to whether such devices are protected from radio frequency signals in the environment. You can also contact your doctor with regard to this.

Emergency calls

- Ensure that the mobile phone is linked to the GSM network and switched on. If necessary, enter the emergency number and carry out your call.
- Inform the member of staff in the emergency call centre with regard to your location.
- Only end the call when the member of staff in the emergency call centre has permitted you to do so.

Children and pets

Keep the mobile phone, batteries, chargers and accessories out of reach of children and pets. Children and/or pets may swallow small parts and suffer choking and other hazards. Children may only use the mobile phone when supervised by an adult.

Aircraft, vehicles and road safety

• Switch the mobile phone off in an aircraft.

Please observe the applicable restrictions and regulations.

Wireless devices can interfere with the functionality aeronautical equipment. It is essential to follow instructions from aircraft personnel regarding using the mobile phone on an aircraft.

Safety instructions

- As the driver of a vehicle, the main priority is: Safety in road traffic and for road users
 - Using the mobile phone while driving could distract your attention leading to dangerous situations. In addition, it contravenes current, applicable laws.

SIM cards, memory cards and data connection cables

Do not remove the cards from the mobile phone while sending or receiving data:
 Doing so increases the risk of loss of data and damage to the mobile phone or memory cards.

Defective devices

- Installation or repair of the product may only be performed by qualified service personnel.
- Dispose of defective devices or have them repaired by our customer service department; such devices could interfere with other wireless services.
- If the mobile phone is treated roughly, e.g. allowed to fall, the display could break and the electronic circuitry and sensitive interior parts could be damaged.
- Do not use the device if the display is cracked or broken. Glass or plastic splinters can injure the hands and face.
- If the mobile phone, battery or accessories malfunction, please contact your Gigaset Service Centre regarding an inspection.

Further important information

- Never point the flash light directly in the eyes of people or animals. If a flash light is aimed at the human eye when too near, there is a risk of temporary loss of sight or impairment of vision.
- If the device becomes hot, please put it to one side for a while and cancel any programmes which are being executed at the time. If you come into contact with a device which is hot, there is a risk of slight skin irritation, e.g. redness of the skin.
- Do not paint or varnish the mobile phone. Varnish/Paint could damage parts of the mobile phone and cause operational breakdowns.

First steps

This chapter describes the contents of the package and how to start operating the mobile phone for the first time.

Package contents

- · Mobile phone Gigaset GL395 including battery
- Charger
- Charging cable to recharge the battery and data transfer

Check the package contents are complete prior to starting up the mobile phone. In case of doubt, contact our customer service.


Getting started

Inserting the SIM and memory cards

You can insert a micro-SIM card and a memory card in the mobile phone.




- 1 Insert your fingernail or a suitable aid into the recess in the left-hand corner of the rear side.
- 2 Prise the battery compartment cover upwards to open it.



- 3 Insert the SIM card in the left-hand slot. Pay attention that the SIM card is inserted properly aligned.
- 4 You can also insert a memory card, as an option, in the right-hand slot.
- ➤ You have inserted a SIM card and memory card in the mobile phone.

Inserting the battery and closing the cover



Insert the battery as illustrated.
 Pay attention that the battery is inserted properly aligned.



- 2 Replace the battery compartment cover as illustrated.
- 3 Press the cover down carefully to close it. The battery compartment locks in place with an audible click.
- ➤ You have inserted the battery in the mobile phone.

Charging the battery



- 1 Insert the USB plug on the charging cable in the charger
- 2 Place the mobile phone in the charger.

or



- 1 Insert the USB plug on the charging cable in the USB port on the bottom of the mobile phone.
- 2 Connect the free USB plug on the charging cable to a suitable plugin power supply unit (not contained in the package supplied).
- 3 Connect the plug-in power supply uni to a properly installed power socket.
- ➤ You have connected the mobile phone to a power source. The battery is being charged.

Ensure the battery is charged fully before starting to use the mobile phone for the first time.

The battery is fully charged when the charge icon in the icon bar is completely filled.



If you have set that the battery should only be charged to 80%, the charge indicator remains with 4 bars and the battery only charges to 80%.

Operating the mobile phone

This chapter describes the basic steps for operating the mobile phone.

Switching the mobile phone on/off

Switch the mobile phone on:

- 1 Press the End Call key **longer**.
- 2 Enter the PIN related to the SIM card inserted using the keypad ## on the mobile phone.



The PIN was supplied together with the SIM card by your mobile phone provider. In case of doubt, contact your mobile phone provider.

- 3 Confirm the selection by pressing the **OK** key in the display (\rightarrow p. 16).
- You have switched on the mobile phone.

Switch the mobile phone off:

- 1 Press the End Call key **[Tonger**.
- You have switched off the mobile phone.

Activating the display

The lighting in the display switches off automatically after 30 seconds (idle status). This function reduces the battery usage of the mobile phone.

Switch the display on:

- 1 Press any key on the mobile phone.
- ▶ You have switched on the display of the mobile phone.

Switching the keypad lock on/off

The keypad lock inhibits all input via the keys and prevents inadvertent operation of the mobile phone.

Switching on the keypad lock:

- 1 Press the **Keypad Lock key** for 2 seconds.
- ➤ You have switched the keypad lock on: The icon appears in the display.

Switching the keypad lock off:

- 1 Press the **Keypad Lock key** for 2 seconds.
- You have switched the keypad lock off: The ficon appears in the display.



The keypad lock is deactivated when a call is received. You can accept the call. It then locks again when the call ends.

Please note that when the keypad lock function is activated, no call numbers, including no emergency call numbers, can be entered.

Switching the torch on/off

The torch can be switched on and off using the torch key. The torch lamp is on the top side of the mobile phone (\rightarrow p. 4).



The torch can only be switched on when the mobile phone is already activated (\rightarrow p. 14).

Switch the torch on:

- 1 Press the **Torch key** for 2 seconds.
- You have switched the torch on.

Switch the torch off:

- 1 Press the **Torch key** for 2 seconds.
- You have switched the torch off.



The torch uses up a lot of energy. Therefore, switch it off when it is not needed.

Using the Control key (Navigation keys)




The Control key, also referred to as the Navigation key, serves to navigate through menus and input fields. The Control key is located between the Take Call key and End Call key.

Functions of the Control key

In idle status:	Open the menu
	Open the menu
During a call	Raise caller volume for the receiver/handsfree function
	Lower caller volume for the receiver/handsfree function
In the menus:	Move upwards in the list of menu entries
	Move downwards in the list of menu entries
During text input:	Move one text field upwards
	Move one text field downwards

Display keys

The display keys are used to execute the functions indicated in the display. The display functions are indicated at the bottom left and bottom right of the mobile phone display and are dependent on the menu currently displayed.



Some examples of the functions of the display keys are illustrated below:

Menu	Contacts	Open main menu/submenu
OK	Back	Confirm menu function / Save entry
Options	Back	To open a submenu:
Options	Clear	Delete character by character to the left

- 1 Press the left-hand or right-hand display key.
- You have executed the display functions indicated in the display.

Icons in the status bar

The icons in the status bar at the top edge of the display indicate current settings and the operating status of the mobile phone:



Vibration is activated, ringing tone is deactivated



Silent function is activated



Missed call in call list



Alarm clock is activated



Voice message missed



Device connected via USB

Wireless communication for SIM card 1



The number of bars in the icon indicates the quality of the current connection.

Battery charge status



Empty



Ca. 50%



The bars in the indicator light up in succession during the charging process.

Menu guidance

The mobile phone menu is comprised of a main menu and several submenus.

To provide a better orientation, the complete menu overview is depicted in this User Guide: → p. 75

Main menu

The functions in the main menu are indicated by an icon and a name.

Navigation in the main menu:

- 1 Press the Menu display key or one of the Navigation keys.
- 2 Use the control keys to select a submenu (e.g. Settings). The menu currently selected has a coloured background.
- 3 Confirm the selection by pressing the **OK** key in the display.
- ▶ You have opened the submenu.

Submenus

The functions in the submenus are displayed in list form.

The menu entry currently selected has a coloured background. If the name of the entry does not fit in one line, the text runs through.

If there are further entries, a scroll bar appears which indicates the position of the entry in the submenu.

Access a function:

- 1 Select a submenu (e.g. Settings).
- 2 Confirm the selection by pressing the **OK** key in the display.
- You have opened the submenu selected.

Switch to previous menu level:

- 1 Press the End Call key or the Prev. display key.
- ▶ The previous menu level appears.

Entering text

Each key between 2 and 9 and the 0 key are assigned several letters and digits. When a key is pressed, the possible characters are shown at the bottom of the display. The selected character is highlighted.



In order to write a text (SMS) there are several options available $(\rightarrow p. 38)$.

Select the letters/numbers:

- 1 Press the key selected several times **briefly** in succession.
- ▶ You run through the letters and digits assigned in sequence.

Deleting characters to the left beside the cursor:

- 1 Press the **Delete** display key.
- 2 Press the **Delete** display key again to delete further characters.
- You have deleted characters to the left of the cursor.

Switching between lower case and upper case letters (abc, Abc, ABC, 123) or entering digits (abc, Abc, ABC, 123):

- 1 Press the [#4].Hash key.
- ▶ You can switch between lower and upper case or entering digits only.

When entering text, you can enter special characters:

- 1 Press the Star key.
- 2 Select the special character required.
- ▶ You have selected the special character required.

Making/Taking calls

This chapter describes the options available with which to telephone using the mobile phone. This includes the various ways to make and take calls.

It also includes the description of functions which can be used during a call.

Making calls using the keypad

You can make national and international calls directly using the dialling keys on the mobile phone keypad.

Dial a national phone number:

- 1 Enter the relevant phone number of the contact required, including access code, using the keypad ##.
- 2 Press the Options display key.
- 3 Select Call.
- 4 Confirm the selection by pressing the **Select** key in the display.
- You have dialled a phone number using the dialling keypad.

Dial an international phone number:

- 1 Press the Star key *+ twice, until the + sign is inserted.
- You have dialled an international phone number.

You can delete digits or cancel dialling a phone number:

Delete digits:

1 Press the **Delete** display key.

Cancel dialling

- Press the **Delete** display key, until all digits are deleted
- 2 Press the **Back** display key.

Making calls from the phone book

- 1 Press the Contacts key in the display.
- 2 Select the entry required.
- 3 Press the Options display key.
- 4 Select Call.
- 5 Confirm the selection by pressing the **Select** key in the display.
- You have dialled a phone number from the phone book.

Detailed information on the phone book: → p. 30

Making calls from a call list

The call lists contain the last calls taken, rejected and missed.

- 1 Press the Call key .
- 2 Select the entry required.
- 3 Press the Call key .
- You have dialled a phone number from the call list.

or

- 1 Press the **Menu** key in the display.
- 2 Select Call Logs.
- 3 Select the required call list (e.g. missed calls).
- 4 Press the Call key .
- > You have dialled a phone number from the call list.

Making calls with the direct dialling keys

You can assign important phone numbers to the direct dialling keys A, B and C.







Select a direct dialling key:

1 Press the required direct dialling key (A, B or C) longer.

or

- 1 Press the **Menu** key in the display.
- 2 Select Settings.
- 3 Confirm the selection by pressing the **OK** key in the display.
- 4 Select **Speed dial**.
- 5 Confirm the selection by pressing the **OK** key in the display.
- 6 Select Set numbers.
- 7 Confirm the selection by pressing the **OK** key in the display.
- 8 Select the required key A, B or C.
- 9 Select Options.
- 10 Select Enter number.
- 11 Enter the **#** call number.
- 12 Select Save.

Making/Taking calls

or

- 1 Select the required key A, B or C.
- 2 Select Options.
- 3 Select Phonebook.
- 4 Select Select.
- 5 Select the entry required.
- 6 Confirm the selection by pressing the **OK** key in the display.
- ▶ You have assigned a phone number to a direct dialling key.

Dialling a phone number using a direct dialling key

- 1 Press the required direct dialling key A, B or C longer.
- ▶ You have dialled the phone number assigned to the direct dialling key.

Taking calls

An incoming call is indicated by a ringtone from the mobile phone. The display of the mobile phone shows the phone number of the caller (if transmitted). If the caller is in the phone book, the name assigned appears.

Take a call:

1 Press the Call key .

or

- 1 Press the **Answer** display key.
- You have taken an incoming call.

Rejecting a call:

1 Press the End Call key .

or

- 1 Press the **Reject** display key.
- You have rejected an incoming call.

Ending a call in progress:

- 1 Press the End Call key .
- You have ended a phone call which was in progress.

If you do not take an incoming call, it is recorded in the **Missed call** call list(\rightarrow p. 28).

Settings for incoming calls

Activating/Deactivating ringtone and/or vibration: → p. 66

Take call with any key: → p. 66

Protection against unwanted calls (blocklist)

You can enter up to 20 numbers in a blocklist.

Calls from these numbers are forwarded directly to the mailbox and not indicated by the mobile phone.

Entries in the blocklist can be made manually or you assume phone numbers from the phone book or a call list.

Activating the blocklist

Activate the blocklist in order to add entries.

- 1 Press the Menu key in the display.
- 2 Select Settings.
- 3 Confirm the selection by pressing the **OK** key in the display.
- 4 Select Security settings.
- 5 Confirm the selection by pressing the **OK** key in the display.
- 6 Select Blocklist.
- 7 Confirm the selection by pressing the **OK** key in the display.
- 8 Select Reject numbers in Blocklist.
- 9 Confirm the selection by pressing the **OK** key in the display. 10 Select **On/Off**.
- 11 Confirm the selection by pressing OK (\bigcirc = selected).
- You have switched the blocklist on.

Adding phone numbers to the blacklist

You can enter up to 20 numbers the blocklist.

- 1 Press the **Menu** key in the display.
- 2 Select Settings.
- 3 Confirm the selection by pressing the **OK** key in the display.
- 4 Select Security settings.
- 5 Confirm the selection by pressing the **OK** key in the display.
- 6 Select Blocklist.
- 7 Confirm the selection by pressing the **OK** key in the display.
- 8 Select Blocklist numbers.
- 9 Confirm the selection by pressing the **OK** key in the display.
- 10 Select an empty memory location (<empty>).
- 11 Select Options.
- 12 Select Edit.
- 13 Select Select.

Making/Taking calls

Add phone numbers manually:

10 Enter the phone number using the keypad 👫.

11 Select Options.

12 Select Done.

or add a number from the phone book:

10 Select Options.

11 Select Add from Phonebook.

12 Confirm the selection by pressing the **OK** key in the display.

13 Select the entry required.

14 Confirm the selection by pressing the **OK** key in the display. or add a number from the call list:

10 Select Menu.

11 Select Call Logs.

 $12\,Confirm$ the selection by pressing the OK key in the display.

13 Select the required call list (e.g. missed calls).

14 Confirm the selection by pressing the \mathbf{OK} key in the display.

15 Select the entry required.

16 Select Options.

17 Select Add to Blocklist.

18 Confirm the selection by pressing the **OK** key in the display.

▶ You have assigned a phone number to the blocklist.

During a phone call

The functions described here are available while a phone call is in progress.

Handsfree mode

You can use the loudspeaker of the mobile phone for a phone call (handsfree). This means that you have both hands free during the conversation.

Activate Handsfree mode:

- 1 Press the **Options** key in the display.
- 2 Select H-Free.
- 3 Confirm the selection by pressing the **OK** key in the display.
- You have switched Handsfree mode on.
 The caller can be heard via the loudspeaker.

Deactivate Handsfree mode:

- 1 Press the **Options** key in the display.
- 2 Select H-Held.
- 3 Confirm the selection by pressing the **OK** key in the display.
- You have switched Handsfree mode off.
 The caller can be heard via the receiver.

You can also activate or deactivate Handsfree mode during connection to another phone number.

Switch Handsfree mode on when a connection is being made:

- 1 Press the **H-Free** display key.
- You have switched Handsfree mode on. As soon as the connection is made, the caller can be heard via the loudspeaker.

Switch Handsfree mode on when a connection is being made:

- 1 Press the **H-Held** display key.
- You have switched Handsfree mode off.
 As soon as the connection is made, the caller can be heard via the receiver.

Adjusting the loudspeaker during a phone call

The volume of the caller can be adjusted to different levels. The setting adjustment applies for the receiver and loudspeaker for Handsfree mode.

Adjust the volume during a phone call:

- 1 Press the Control key to raise the volume.
- 2 Press the Control key to lower the volume.

or

- 1 Press the **Options** key in the display.
- 2 Select Volume.
- 3 Confirm the selection by pressing the **OK** key in the display.
- 4 Press the Control key to raise the volume.
- 5 Press the Control key to lower the volume.
- 6 Select Back.



The setting is automatically saved after about 3 seconds if you do not select **Back**.

You have set the volume for the phone call.

Muting the microphone

If the microphone is muted, the caller can no longer hear you.

Mute the microphone:

- 1 Press the **Options** key in the display.
- 2 Select Mute.
- 3 Confirm the selection by pressing the **OK** key in the display.
- You have muted the microphone. The caller can no longer hear you.

Switch the microphone back on:

- 1 Press the **Options** key in the display.
- Select Unmute.
- 3 Confirm the selection by pressing the **OK** key in the display.
- ➤ You have switched the microphone on. The caller can hear you again.

Call divert

In the case of call divert, calls are forwarded to another phone number or to the mailbox.



Not all network providers support the call divert function.

Setting up call divert

Before the call divert function can be set up, the call divert function must be switched on.

Switch on the call divert function:

- 1 Press the **Menu** key in the display.
- 2 Select Settings.
- 3 Confirm the selection by pressing the **OK** key in the display.
- 4 Select Call settings.
- 5 Confirm the selection by pressing the **OK** key in the display.
- 6 Select Call divert.
- 7 Confirm the selection by pressing the **OK** key in the display.
- 8 Select one of the following options:

Divert all voice calls, Divert if unreachable, Divert if no answer, Divert if busy

9 Confirm the selection by pressing the **OK** key in the display.

10 Select Activate.

11 Select the destination (phone number or mailbox) for the diverted calls.

Divert to a phone number:

- 1 Select To new number.
- 2 Confirm the selection by pressing the **OK** key in the display.
- 3 Enter the phone number using the keypad
- 4 Select Options.
- 5 Select Done.

or

- 1 Select Options.
- 2 Select Add from Phonebook.
- 3 Select the contact required.
- 4 Confirm the selection by pressing the **OK** key in the display.

Making/Taking calls

Divert to a mailbox:



The number of the mailbox is assigned to Key 1 (→ p. 33).

- Select To voicemail.
- You have set up the call divert to another phone number or the mailbox.

Revoking call divert

Switch off the call divert function:

- 1 Press the Menu key in the display.
- 2 Select Settings.

Mailbox

If your phone provider provides you with a mailbox (answering machine), a caller can leave a message for you if you do not take the call.

In order to play and listen to voice messages in your mailbox, you need the phone number of the mailbox. If necessary, ask your mobile service provider with regard to the call number.

You can listen to the messages on the mailbox:

- 1 Enter the phone number of the mailbox using the keypad 4.
- 2 Press the Call key .
- 3 Follow the mailbox voice guidance.
- ▶ You have listened to the messages on your mailbox.

When you use the [] key for the first time, you must enter the phone number of the mailbox.

Emergency calls (SOS)

The mobile phone offers the following SOS functions:

Do not use local, national or international emergency numbers.

SOS calls

The SOS key provides a private emergency call function. By pressing the SOS key, you can call up to five numbers and/or send an SMS (text message).

As long as the mobile phone remains connected to the PC, the File Manager function is not available.

Camera and image viewer

The mobile phone is equipped with a camera (→ p. 4). The **Camera** application provides access to your photos and you can also adjust the camera settings.

Quick access to your photos is possible using the Gallery application.

Resetting to the factory settings

If you want to hand the mobile phone over to a third party, you can reset it to the factory settings. All the individual settings are reset, the call lists and phone book entries in the phone's internal memory are deleted.

On resetting the factory settings, all the data stored (e.g. photos) are deleted from the mobile phone. This process cannot be reversed.


