

Please read these instructions carefully. Failure to comply presents a risk of injury and damage to a device, as well as breaches of applicable laws.

Please explain to your children the contents of this document as well as the potential risks associated with using this device.

General information

- For your own safety, only use original, approved accessories from Gigaset for your mobile phone. Using incompatible accessories can damage the mobile phone and entail hazardous situations. Original accessories can be purchased from Gigaset Customer Service (see Customer service United Kingdom and Ireland → p. 71).
- The mobile phone is not waterproof. The device or its accessories must therefore not be kept or charged in damp environments (in bathrooms, shower rooms or kitchens for example). Rain, moisture or any liquid can contain minerals which can cause the electrical circuitry to corrode. There is a risk of electric shock, fire or damage when the device is being charged.
- Permitted temperature range for charging and operation: 10 to 40°C.
 High temperatures can shorten the life of electronic devices and damage the battery; plastic parts can deform or melt. Using or keeping the mobile phone in refrigerated areas can result in condensation on the inside of the telephone which will destroy the electronic circuitry.
- The mobile phone must not be used or kept in dusty or dirty places. Dust can be a reason for the mobile phone to malfunction.
- Switch off your mobile phone when in potentially explosive areas and observe all
 warning signs. Potentially explosive areas also include places where switching off
 vehicle engines is normally recommended. It is at these kinds of places that flying
 sparks can be the cause of explosions or fires with resulting injuries, and there may
 be a risk to life.
 - These areas include petrol stations, chemical factories, transport and storage systems for hazardous chemicals, spaces under ship decks, areas in which the air contains chemical substances or fine particles (such as dust or metal powder particles).
- Short-circuiting, disassembling and modifying the mobile phone are not permitted because they present a risk of injury, electric shock, fire or damage to the charger.
- Charges might apply when establishing Internet connections via the SIM card.

Battery and charging



Not replacing the battery properly can pose a risk of explosion.

Dispose of used batteries in line with the instructions (Section Waste and environmental protection → p. 75).

- Never burn or heat batteries, and do not dispose of them in environments which
 are at risk of heat or fire to prevent battery fluid escaping, overheating, explosion
 and fire. Do not disassemble, weld and/or modify the battery. Do not keep the
 battery where it is exposed to strong mechanical effects.
- Do not use any sharp objects (such as screwdrivers) to touch or pierce the battery.
 There is a risk that battery fluid will escape or the battery will overheat, explode or catch fire and burn. Crushing, heating and burning batteries are strictly prohibited.
- The battery electrolyte coming into contact with eyes can cause a loss of eyesight.
 If electrolyte does enter an eye, please do not rub the eye with a hand. Immediately
 wash the affected eye thoroughly with clear water and consult a doctor. The electrolyte coming into contact with skin (or clothing) presents a risk of skin burns.
 Immediately wash the skin or clothing thoroughly with soap and clear water, and
 consult a doctor if required.
- Never use batteries for purposes other than those specified. Never use a damaged battery. If the battery becomes hot, discolours, deforms or becomes leaky whilst being used, charged or kept in a safe place, it must be replaced immediately by a new battery for safety reasons.
- The battery temperature rises during the charging process. Do not keep the battery together with ignitable products in the same drawer as this poses a risk of fire.
- Do not charge the battery for longer than 12 hours.
- Only charge the device indoors. Whilst the phone is charging, do not use the phone for calls or dial any numbers.
- The socket must be easily accessible during the charging process.
- Electrical storms pose a risk of electric shocks.
- Do not use the charger when the power cable is damaged or no battery is inserted in the mobile phone because this poses a risk of electric shock and fire.

Headset



High volumes can impair hearing.

Listening to music or conversation with headphones set to a loud volume can be unpleasant and permanently impair hearing.

To prevent loss of hearing, do not have the volume turned up too high for long periods.

If you wear headphones whilst out walking or running, please ensure that the cord
does not wrap itself around your body or objects on your person.

Only wear headphones in dry environments. The static electricity which builds up
on the headphones can discharge via your ears as an electric shock. The static electricity can discharge if you touch the headphones with your hand or touch bare
metal before connecting with the mobile phone.

Use in hospitals / medical devices

- The function of medical equipment near your product can be impaired. Bear in mind the technical conditions of the environment in question (such as in a doctors' surgery).
- If you use a medical device such as a pacemaker, please consult the manufacturer
 of the product before using the product. You will be provided information on the
 sensitivity of the device to external, high-frequency energy sources.
- Heart pacemakers, implantable cardioverter defibrillators:
 When you switch on your mobile phone, ensure that the distance between the
 phone and an implant is at least 152 mm. To reduce potential interference, use the
 mobile phone on the opposite side to the implant. Please switch the mobile phone
 off immediately if interference occurs. Do not keep the mobile phone in a shirt
 pocket.
- Hearing aids, cochlear implants:
 Some digital wireless devices can interfere with hearing aids and cochlear implants. Please consult the manufacturers of these products if interference occurs.
- Other medical devices:
 If you and the people around you use other medical devices, please contact the relevant manufacturer for information on whether such devices are protected from radio frequency signals in the environment. You can also consult your doctor about this.

Emergency calls

- Make sure the mobile phone is switched on and connected to the GSM network.
 Enter the emergency number as required and speak.
- Tell the person at the emergency call centre your location.
- Do not end the conversation until the person at the emergency call centre asks you
 to.

Children and pets

Keep the mobile phone, batteries, chargers and accessories out of the reach of children and pets. Children and/or pets can swallow the small parts, posing a risk of suffocation and other hazards. A child may only use the mobile phone under the supervision of an adult.

Aeroplanes, vehicles and road safety

- Switch off your mobile phone in aeroplanes.
 Please observe applicable restrictions and regulations.
 Wireless devices can interfere with the function of aeronautical equipment. Follow the instructions issued by flight personnel when using your mobile phone.
- The absolute priority for every vehicle driver and everyone in a vehicle is safety on the roads and for road users.
 - Using a mobile phone whilst driving can be distracting and therefore lead to dangerous situations. You may also be violating applicable laws.

SIM card, memory card and data connector cable

 Do not remove the card from the mobile phone whilst data is being sent or received as this presents a risk of data loss and damage to the mobile phone or memory card.

Defective devices

- Dispose of faulty devices or have them repaired by our Customer Service team. These devices could interfere with other wireless services.
- Careless handling of the mobile phone, such as dropping it, can shatter the display and damage the electronic circuitry and sensitive parts inside.
- Do not use the device if the display is cracked or shattered. Fragments of glass or plastic can injure hands and face.
- In the event of malfunction of your mobile phone, battery or accessories, please contact a Gigaset Service Centre for an inspection.

Other important information

- Never point the flash light directly at the eyes of people or animals. Pointing a flash light too near to human eyes poses a risk of temporary loss of eyesight or impairment of vision.
- When the device warms up, please put it aside for a while and stop the program
 you were running. Coming into contact with a hot device can cause minor skin irritations such as redness.
- Do not apply lacquer to the mobile phone. Lacquer and paint can damage the parts of the mobile phone and may cause malfunction.



Getting started

Inserting nano SIM cards

You can insert two nano SIM cards into the phone.

- Place your fingernail into the notch in one corner of the cover and pull the cover up.
- ▶ Remove the battery.
- Insert one or both SIM card(s) into the card slots.





If your SIM card is too small, you might need a SIM card adapter.

Inserting a memory card

You can insert a memory card into the phone.

Insert the memory card into the middle of the card slot.



Inserting the battery and closing the cover

- Inserting the battery.
- ▶ Carefully press down the cover until it clicks into place.

Charging the battery

- ► Connect the USB connector on the charger cable supplied to the charging cradle.
- Insert the device.

Or

- Directly connect the USB connector on the charger cable supplied to the device.
- ▶ Connect the charger cable to the power source.
- Fully charge the device battery before using it for the first time.

The battery is fully charged when the charge icon in the icon bar is completely full.





If you will not be using the phone for several days, switch off your device.

If you will not be using the phone for several weeks, switch it off and remove the battery.

Setting up the mobile phone

When you turn on the mobile phone for the first time, a Setup Wizard starts with which the initial, important settings are configured.

You can change all the settings later on from menu Settings.



You can not cancel the Setup Wizard and can not switch off the device during the setup process.

Selecting the language

▶ ⑤ Select the language required ➤ OK ➤ Next

Selecting the keypad

▶ (Select the keypad required ▶ OK ▶ Next

Selecting a network

If you are within range of a WLAN, you can register the mobile phone.

Do not register now: ▶ Skip

Permitting/rejecting location access

Specify whether programmes (apps) should receive information about your location.

Have the date and time set automatically using a time server in the network

Quick access to frequently used settings

Specify whether you want frequently used functions (speaker, mobile data, Bluetooth, airplane mode, ...) to be enabled/disabled with the Control key at the top (a).

This ends the Setup Wizard - the start screen is shown (display in idle mode).

Locking/unlocking the keypad

The keypad lock prevents any accidental use of the phone.

Lock/unlock the keypad: ▶ Press and **hold** the star key 💉

The keypad lock is shown on the display.

Adjusting the volume

The volume keys are on the right-hand side of the phone.

When phone is in **idle**: The volumes for ringtones and alarms on the phone can be set to 15 levels.

During a **call**: The volume for handset/speaker can be set to 5 levels.

Louder: Press the upper volume key

Quieter: Press the lower volume key







Enable the display again: ▶ Press any key



Idle display



Display keys and functions

The display keys perform different functions depending on operating situation.



▶ Press the display key to call the function shown in the display above. In some scenarios, a display function is also shown in the middle of the display.

Enable display function: ▶ Press the control key in the middle 🔳

Examples:

Idle display: Opening menu

When dialling: CALL Initiating a call

During a call: Enable the speaker

Status bar

Icons display current settings and the status of the phone, e.g.:



Ringtone disabled, only silent alert active

Wireless connection for SIM cards



The icon is displayed for every SIM card inserted.

The number of white bars indicates the connection quality.

Battery charge level



The area inside the outline indicates the battery charge level. A lightning icon is shown during the charge process.

WLAN connection quality




The icon indicates the connection with a wireless network. The number of curves indicates the connection quality.

Access to social networks

When the phone is in idle, the display provides direct access to social networks WhatsApp, Facebook, YouTube, Maps and Google (search). You might need an account and have to enter the associated access details.







The subsequence process is dependent on the app selected. You might need to log in and/or configure settings. Follow the instructions from the manufacturer.

The social networks can also be accessed from the main menu of the phone.

Remove access to WhatsApp and Facebook:

▶ (a) Select the app ▶ Options ▶ Uninstall ▶ OK ▶ Confirm with Uninstall

Direct access to WhatsApp

 Press the WhatsApp key between the two display keys



Quickly accessing functions

When the phone is in idle, it provides quick access to frequently used functions.

Enable/disable the torch, airplane mode, WLAN, wireless data and Bluetooth®:

► (a) ► Select the desired function ► OK

Adjust the ringtone volume:

▶ Use to set the required volume on 15 levels, plus SILENT and VIBRATE

Switch between VIBRATE, SILENT and ringtone:

▶ (**a**) **▶** OK

Set the display brightness:

► Use to navigate to the **Brightness** icon ► **OK** ... The brightness changes between 10, 40, 70 and 100%

Back to the idle display ▶ Press the On/Off key 🔊

Showing messages

From the idle display, you can show messages that are stored by apps or the system. The number of messages currently available is shown by an icon in the top left of the display. The icon is orange if there are new messages.



Show messages:

▶ Press the display key **Notices** ... The available messages are listed

Show message: ▶ (a) Select message ▶ OK

Back to the message list ▶ Press the On/Off key [3]

Delete the message selected: > Clear

Delete all messages: ▶ Clear all



Configure the display of messages: → p. 61

Using the menus

The apps, functions and settings on your phone are displayed in a menu that has a number of levels.

Menu overview → p. 79

Opening a menu

When the phone is in idle, press ■ ... The main menu is opened > Use the Control key (a) to select the submenu > OK

Menu display

The main menu is displayed in the individual, list and grid views.

- The individual view shows, for every submenu, an icon that fills the screen.
- The list view shows all icons with associated names.
- The grid view always shows nine icons on the display.

The menu entry currently selected is coloured. If there are more entries, a bar is shown on the right that shows the position of the entry in the submenu.

To access a function: ▶ ♠ Select a function ▶ **OK**

Back to the idle display: ▶ Press and hold the On/Off key [3]

Changing the view

On the idle screen, press
 → Options →
 ♦ Select Grid View / List View / Single View → OK

Moving submenus

In the list and grid views, submenus can be moved to simplify access to more frequently used apps and functions.

Sharing contacts, images and ringtones

The phone is able to send data such as contacts, images and ringtones to other devices using Bluetooth, as an attachment to a text message (MMS), as an email or with WhatsApp or Facebook.



For this to work, the relevant function or app must be set up and enabled. Setup can be performed on initial usage.

Example: Sharing contacts

Contacts ➤ Options ➤ (a) Share ➤ (b) Select the app you want to use to share the contact ➤ OK

Bluetooth: ▶ (**a**) **Bluetooth** ▶ **OK** ▶ Select the device ▶ **OK**

Message: ▶ (a) Messages ▶ OK ▶ Enter the phone number of the recip-

ient and the text ▶ Send message

Email: ▶ (a) Email ➤ OK ➤ Enter the email address of the recipient, the subject and the text ➤ Send email

WhatsApp: → **(a)** WhatsApp → OK → Enter the recipient → Send message

Facebook: → (a) Facebook → OK → Enter the recipient → Send message

Entering text

Every key from 1 to 0 is assigned multiple letters and digits. The most important characters available are on the keys.

Select letters/digits:

▶ Press the key **briefly** several times in succession

Delete characters to the left of the cursor:

Switch between upper and lower case and enter digits (Abc, abc, ABC, 123):

Dialling from a call list

The call lists contain the most recent accepted, outgoing and missed calls.

▶ Press the Talk key ▶ ■ Select the call list ▶ ■ Select the entry
 ▶ Press the Talk key or CALL

Dialling with quick dial keys



The quick dial key is assigned a number from Contacts (→ p. 32).

Important numbers can be dialled with quick dial keys A, B and C with one key press.

When phone is in idle: Press and hold key A, B or C ... the number stored is dialled immediately



Dialling emergency numbers with the SOS key



The SOS function must be enabled and at least one number from Contacts assigned to the SOS key (→ p. 63).

Keep the SOS key on the back of the phone pressed for at least 3 seconds
 (→ p. 5)

The first of the SOS numbers defined is called. If the person called does not answer, the next SOS number is called, etc. Up to five SOS numbers can be entered



The SOS functionality can be impaired by the parallel operation of applications (apps). Stop running applications.

Accepting a call

An incoming call is indicated by a ringtone and by the phone number of the caller on the display (if transferred). The name of the caller is displayed if the caller is in the directory.

Accept a call:

- ► Fold open the phone ► Press the Talk key or display key **Accept** Reject a call:
- ▶ Press the End key or display key **Decline**

Answer a call with an SMS:

Access display function Reply using ■ ... Predefined texts are listed ▶ (a)
 Select the text ▶ OK ... The text is sent as an SMS

End a call:

▶ Press the end key 🗗

When you do not accept a call, it is saved in the **Missed** call list $(\rightarrow p. 27)$.

Settings for incoming calls

Enable/disable the ringtone and/or vibration: → p. 59

Change the call answering mode when the phone is folded down: → p. 63

During a call

Handsfree mode

When making calls, you can use the speaker on the mobile phone (handsfree mode). The vicon is shown as the display function.

Enable/disable handsfree mode during a call or when the connection is being set up:

▶ Press the Control key in the middle 🔳

Changing the call volume

The call volume can be adjusted on 5 levels using the volume keys on the right-hand side of the phone. The setting applies for the receiver and speaker for handsfree mode.

Louder: Press the upper volume key

Quieter: Press the lower volume key

or

▶ Options ▶ (a) Volume ▶ OK ▶ (b) Select the volume ... The setting is applied automatically after a short time

Muting the microphone

When the microphone is switched off, callers no longer hear you.

Turn off the microphone:

Mute

Turn on the microphone:

Unmute

Call lists

The phone saves different types of calls (missed, dialled and received) in lists.

Opening the call list

▶ • Press the Talk key

The Call Log menu contains a submenu for every call type:

Missed, Dialed, Received

The calls for all call types are summarised in All.

Contacts

From Contacts, you can manage the contact details of the recipients of your calls, messages and emails. Contacts can be stored in the internal phone memory or on the SIM cards. You can manually create contacts, copy them from a call list or, when pre-dialling, copy them to Contacts.

Opening and showing contacts

▶ Press the control key

or: ▶ Press the display key Contacts

or: ▶ (■) ▶ (♣) Contacts ▶ OK

Information about contacts

The list contains the contacts in alphabetical order, with first and last names. Contacts stored on a SIM card are denoted by the H icon.

A contact contains the following information:

First/last names and phone number.

Contacts stored in the phone can contain further information:

Other phone numbers, email addresses, image, company, address, birthday, message and an individual ringtone.

Display all information about a contact:

Finding contacts




